ABSTRACT

Middle Brook Street, Winchester; continuity and change in a city centre street

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This independent study has been completed as a requirement for a higher degree of the University of Winchester.

Middle Brook Street, Winchester, has a long history of habitation, originally laid by the Romans due to its location on a raised chalk 'island' in the Itchen River valley. Saxons carved a water channel down the street for use by trades and residents, drawing occupations that utilised the water supply in their processes, which ultimately polluted the water and contributed to the spread of disease. The water channel was eventually diverted into a new sewer system in 1875. This study identifies the demographics of the residents of the street and their occupations during a time of population growth and change between 1841 and 2000. In addition, it explores the loss of the water channel and the effect it had on the occupations and the character of the street during the time of transition, between 1841-1911, ultimately concluding that it was not the loss of the water channel that influenced changes in occupation, but rather changes in industry and society.

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## INTRODUCTION

Middle Brook Street, is one of three streets that comprise the 'Brooks' area in the city centre of Winchester, Hampshire. The street was initially laid during the Roman period as part of the development of the settlement *Venta Belgarum*, in the Itchen River valley.<sup>1</sup> The street lies on an alluvial chalk 'island' in the river valley stretching from the North Walls of the city to the cathedral. Due to its raised position, it remained dry and habitable during flooding.<sup>2</sup> The Romans used their extensive knowledge of water manipulation to divert the Itchen to the east of the city to drain the marshy riverbed, but it was the Saxons who engineered and carved an extensive network of channels in the late 10<sup>th</sup> century that allowed the clear spring water to flow down the three streets of the 'Brooks' area and provide a valuable resource to the residents and trades of the area.<sup>3</sup> The water channels, however, had negative implications on the populace, as well, providing an easy means of waste disposal, resulting in the spread of disease. Therefore, the channels and their location in the city centre attracted large numbers of residents and water-dependent trades, but at the same time resulted in unsanitary living conditions and disease and death. This trend continued until 1875 when, by an Act of Parliament and the insistence of doctors in Winchester, the water was finally diverted into sewers below the streets.<sup>4</sup>

Since the water was culverted and throughout the Industrial Revolution, there have been rapid changes in the 'Brooks' area, which have resulted in a major shift in the character and occupations of the residents of the street in the twentieth and twenty-first centuries. During the First and Second World Wars and up to the 1960's, Middle Brook Street remained densely occupied from the High Street to North Walls. In a national effort to clean up unsanitary slum areas, a large-scale slum clearance was performed in the 1950s and 1960s wherein the large majority of the occupants of the street were rehoused throughout Winchester and the buildings were razed to make way for single dwellings, commercial buildings and a car park. The decrease in population density and expansion of the city centre shops resulted in fewer houses at a premium cost.

The objective of this dissertation is to produce an analysis of the residents, occupations and buildings on Middle Brook Street from 1841 to 2000, identifying the

morphology after the defining feature of the water channel was removed, and exploring how, and if, the character of the street changed as a result. In addition, broad population analysis of the Brooks area is provided from censuses for the period 1800 – 1831, during which time only parish-level information survives.

The study of the changes on Middle Brook Street in the nineteenth to twenty-first centuries provide an important contribution to urban population studies for a number of reasons. Firstly, much has been written about the Brooks area in during the Medieval period, most notably by Derek Keene in his DPhil thesis and Martin Biddle and Keene in the comprehensive *Winchester Studies* series, which spanned the early and later medieval periods.<sup>5</sup> This study helps to continue some aspects of their research into the Modern period, allowing a long-term study of the trades and occupations practised on a continuously-inhabited street, within the hub of a city, over a period of almost two thousand years. By examining the evolution of the character of the street after its defining feature was removed, with emphasis on the change of occupations and health conditions, this study provides a useful approach to the study of urban development since the beginnings of town planning in Britain in the early twentieth century.

Additionally, in creating a long-term study of Middle Brook Street and the residents' relationship to the watercourses, it is possible to examine the development of water-dependent trades over time and the struggles to maintain a source of clean water, culminating in the sanitary issues inherent in urban open channels. This study could potentially be applied to urban environments in developing countries in which open channels still exist, supporting the importance of clean water to avoid disease.

Finally, this dissertation provides useful population data and analysis on the early modern and modern periods in regard to Middle Brook Street, which will be helpful to those researching aspects of the Brooks area. The censuses of 1841, 1851, 1861, 1871, 1891, 1901, and 1911 have been transcribed into an easily comparable spreadsheet format, analysis of the 1905 renumbering of houses has been completed and the rehousing of residents during the Slum Clearance has been compiled into a single report which have been appended to the thesis.

A wide variety of sources has been assembled to provide a comprehensive analysis of the change in character in a unique urban environment over a long period of time.

Fortunately, an extensive amount of resources are available on the city of Winchester, both primary and secondary. In fact, one of the difficulties in researching the topic was the vast amount of information that has been published about Winchester and the Brooks area, including the aforementioned *Winchester Studies* series, and comprehensive books by James and Carpenter Turner.<sup>6</sup> It has been necessary to sift through publications and documents to discover the source of information, and thus, primary sources were used extensively. There is a lack of surviving documents from the period prior to the thirteenth century. However, well-documented excavations have been performed on the Brooks area and the findings, subsequent analysis, and published historical research have been the basis for the sections on the pre-conquest and early medieval periods. Notable excavations in the study area are the Biddle excavations of 1961-1970, in which Lower Brook Street was a focus, the 1987-1988 Scobie and Zant excavation of Middle Brook Street prior to the development of the Brooks Centre, which revealed information specific to the street from the Roman, Anglo-Saxon and medieval periods, and the extensive excavations in the 1980's of the Brooks area.<sup>7</sup>

Keene's thesis and the *Winchester Studies* volumes were the inspiration for this paper and are frequently referenced primary sources that will provide the bulk of information for the chapter on the inhabitants and trades on the street for the medieval period to 1550 AD. Keene primarily used the deeds enrolled in the city court as the 'sole record of most of the surviving property deeds of medieval Winchester.'<sup>8</sup> He also used court rolls, medieval account rolls, post-medieval records and maps to compile a biography of each property in the Brooks area during the time-frame of his study.

Ordnance Survey maps, as well as seventeenth and eighteenth century maps by Speed, Godson and Milne were used to trace the changes in settlement patterns, land usage and assess population contraction and expansion on the street.<sup>9</sup> However, the focus for this

study is on the late Modern period, from 1841 – 2000. For this time period, the *Warren's*, *White's* and *Kelly's* Winchester Directories were instrumental in identifying the inhabitants of Middle Brook Street by name and house number and aided in determining how the houses were renumbered in 1905.<sup>10</sup> However, they did not provide all occupations of the residents, only those that advertised. Occupations and populations figures were identified by the censuses of 1841, 1851, 1861, 1871, 1891, 1901 and 1911.<sup>11</sup> In addition, local history publications, including the Hampshire Field Club and City of Winchester Trust newsletters, have been invaluable in providing accounts of the Muckabite versus Anti-Muckabite debate by W.H. Boorman, and Elizabeth Proudman's historical information on the history of the water channels.<sup>12</sup>

Electoral Rolls were utilised from the twentieth century to determine the number of servicemen living on the street, as well as the number of voting residents, but did not provide the total number of residents or their occupations.<sup>13</sup> Slum Clearance Action Cards identified by name those living on Middle Brook Street that were re-housed elsewhere within the city, and newspaper articles from the *Hampshire Chronicle* and protesting letters written to the City Council have provided information on the debate surrounding demolition and rebuilding on the street during the 1950s and 1960s.<sup>14</sup> In addition, written and oral testimonies of residents, stored at the Hampshire Record Office, provided greater depth to the description of the character of the street in the twentieth century, especially during the world wars.<sup>15</sup>

The dissertation is divided into five chapters. The first chapter provides a historical background to the development of Middle Brook Street during the Saxon, medieval and early modern periods with the aim to examine the evolving character of the street and to provide context. The residents, buildings and trades practiced on the street and how they and the general population used the water are examined to compare with the population in the modern period in chapter four. A brief explanation of the expansion and contraction of

habitation due to economic and population changes are provided using archaeological and historical data.

The second chapter explores the changes to the population on the street during the nineteenth century, what effect poverty, overcrowding and poor sanitation had on the populace, and the underlying struggle to improve conditions. In Chapter three, the focus is on the occupations of residents in the nineteenth to early twentieth centuries, how they differed from the trades practised in centuries past, and their evolution when the water was culverted. The urban morphology of the water channel and its removal in relation to its effect on the residents and character of the street will be examined

The final chapter examines the early twentieth-century renumbering of residences, life on the street during World War 1 and II, the Slum Clearance proposals and enforcement in the 1950s, and what impact regeneration had on the community. Recollections by past residents of life on the street during and after wartime enhance the description of the character of the street. Chapter four closes with the an analysis of the modern Brooks area including the relatively recent developments of the Brooks Centre, King's Walk, the parking garage and commercial buildings. A brief description of the proposed Silver Hill development will indicate how dramatic change continues in the twenty-first century.

There are potential roadblocks in this paper that prevent a more detailed report. Keene's *Survey of Medieval Winchester* is the basis for the first chapter of this study and uses surviving deeds enrolled in the city court. He states that 'For the most part, these concern transactions between private individuals and refer to a high proportion of all the properties in the city and not simply those in the possession of institutions.'<sup>16</sup> Using the deeds, Keene was able to use a wide variety of other sources to flesh out information on individual properties. However, he emphasises that the enrolled deeds that survive are both 'chronologically and topographically incomplete in its coverage'<sup>17</sup>, therefore giving us glimpses into habitation on the street at different time periods, but not a full picture. It is for this reason that the information collected from Keene's research is used to provide a sampling of the trades present during the Medieval period, with explanations as to how the trades interacted with the water channel, instead of providing a comprehensive listing of the occupants of the street.

Middle Brook Street is part of two parishes: St Maurice and St Mary Kalendar. Parish boundaries changed over the study period, which complicated the tracking of information. In addition, parish records provided only births, deaths and marriages, but not

occupations, family size or address and did not track non-Christians, non-conformists or Roman Catholics. Therefore, parish records are not always useful for this type of examination.

Street numbers were not generally used until the nineteenth century and not consistently recorded in the census until 1881. In the early- to mid-1800's, residences were identified by the person residing there or by their trade and contained some inaccuracies.<sup>18</sup> However, they did provide a general picture of the occupations and number of inhabitants on the street.

Finally, as mentioned above, census records are only available from 1841 – 1911. Therefore, electoral registers were used after 1911, but merely provide names and addresses of eligible voters in a household and omit their occupations and the total number of residents. Directories provided names of the head of household, but not always the house number or occupation of the resident. Therefore, information on occupations in the mid to late twentieth century is difficult to compile.

In conclusion, the study of Middle Brook Street from 1841 to the present day will provide a long-term character study of a unique urban street. Analysis of the inhabitants, dwellings, and trades that settled there to take advantage of the flowing water, how they utilised the open channels, and what changed once the defining feature of the water was removed has the potential to provide useful information about the development of water-dependent trades and urban usage over time. By analysing the population, occupations of residents, and character of the street from 1841 to 2000, this paper is furthering elements of the existing work by Keene and Biddle and extends the study into the modern period.

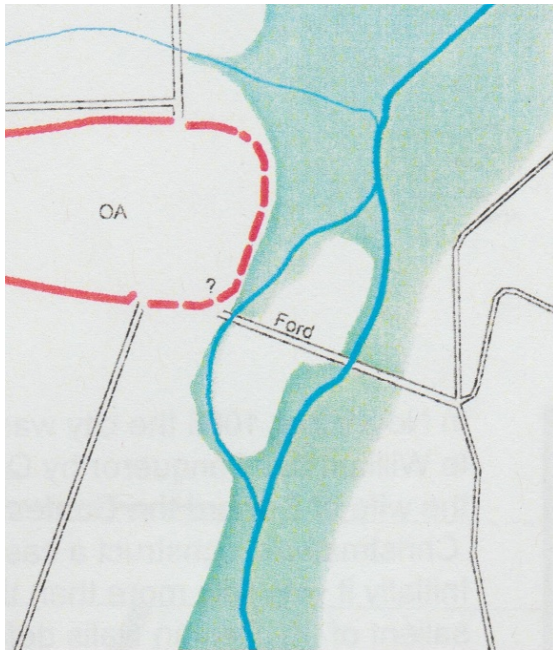

## CHAPTER 1

### ROMAN, SAXON AND MEDIEVAL MIDDLE BROOK STREET

The city of Winchester is rich in documentary and archaeological evidence and numerous excavations have been performed as buildings were torn down and rebuilt, streets widened, and as large-scale projects were undertaken to reveal the extensive history of the city. From these excavations, we know that there has been settlement and agricultural activity in the vicinity of Winchester since the later Neolithic period. However, not until the early Iron Age to the beginning of the Middle Iron Age (600-300 BC) do we see the initial location of the modern city of Winchester in the remains of an enclosure known as ‘Oram’s Arbour’.<sup>19</sup> Covering 20 ha of chalk downland on the western slope of the Itchen River valley, the Oram’s Arbour settlement was established in the middle Iron Age, around the third century BC and located in a strategically important junction of routes, making it ideal for

communication and trade.<sup>20</sup> Its location overlooking the floodplain of the Itchen, was at a point where the river narrowed due to the chalk spurs of St. Giles’ Hill to the east and St. Pauls’ Hill to the west.<sup>21</sup>

### **A New Roman Settlement**

The settlement lay in the path of an ancient route used to cross the river due to a unique topographical feature: alluvial chalk accumulated over time to create a series of raised ‘islands’ in the river’s path which allowed travellers to ford the river with relative ease.<sup>22</sup>

During the Winchester Museums Service excavation of the Brooks area beginning in

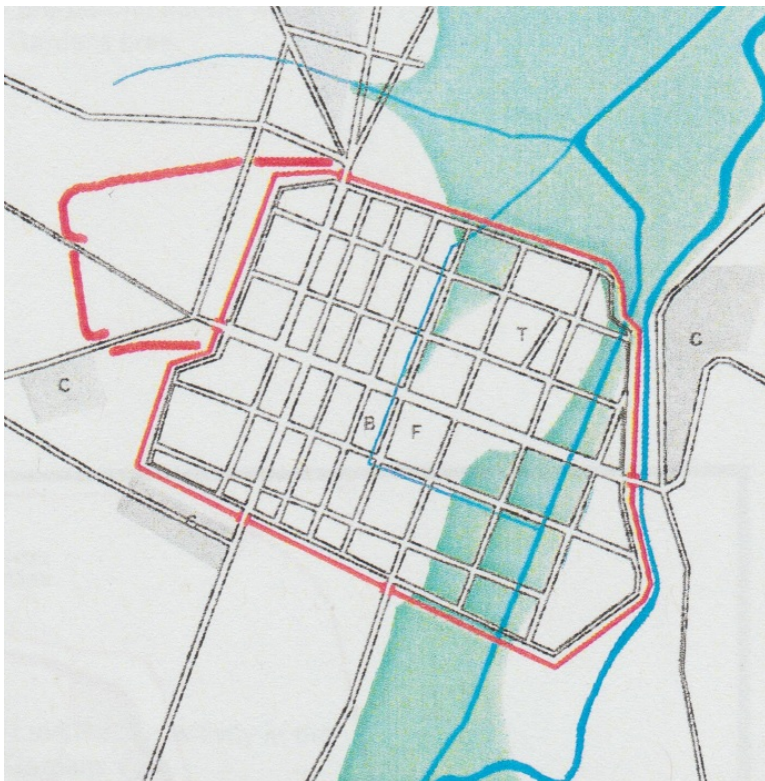

1987, variations in the subsoils revealed a chalk deposit which extended north to south from the eastern edge of the site up to 30 metres west of Middle Brook Street, sloping away sharply to the north and west and more gently to the south, and creating a large 'island' in the marshy floodplain.<sup>23</sup> Once the river was crossed, the traveller would not be able to avoid passing through the settlement and, therefore, trade, communication, and possibly taxes, were guaranteed. Qualmann indicates that the 'siting of the enclosure may have been determined as much by a wish to control these routes as to defend any existing settlement'.<sup>24</sup> Oram's Arbour was most actively used in the first century BC, but was in decline, if not abandoned, by the Claudian invasion of 43 AD.<sup>25</sup> However, its location and topography were perfectly suited for the establishment of a Roman settlement as the land had already been cleared of trees and scrub and its placement on a hilltop would be seen from a greater distance, thereby

exerting a dominant influence on the surrounding landscape.<sup>26</sup> The river, in particular, was the most important feature for the establishment of a Roman settlement, as they sought sites near a good freshwater supply; preferably rivers and springs and most of the new Roman sites were chosen for their topography, often positioned on flood plains of rivers, as were Cirencester, Winchester, Canterbury and Chichester, or on raised ground near a river, as is the case with London, Dorchester, Exeter, Colchester and York.<sup>27</sup>

In Roman Winchester, an east-west street, the current High Street, was laid to ford the river, crossing over the raised island, as indicated by archaeological remains of a raised foundation with ‘rammed gravel metalling’, forming a causeway above the silts and with a timber-lined channel running parallel to the street to drain the wet areas.<sup>28</sup> It was the Roman intention to divert the Itchen to the east of the town and drain the floodplain, making it habitable. Until this was accomplished, the only usable land lay on the raised island. Evidence from the Brooks excavations indicates that the earliest Roman activity took place c.AD 50 on this chalk island with the construction of timber structures, presumably because the land remained permanently dry.<sup>29</sup> It was discovered, during excavations as part of the widening of St. George’s Street in 1953, and the construction of an extension onto Marks and Spencer in 1971 at the corner of the High Street and Middle Brook Street, that a north-south street was laid roughly in line with the present day Middle Brook Street along the highest point on the largest tufa island, approximately 2 metres above the level of the valley floor.<sup>30</sup> This was the birth of Middle Brook Street.

Between c.AD 50 and AD 200, the Roman inhabitants constructed a substantial network of wooden channels and pipes to drain the lower-lying marshy floodplain of the Itchen valley, diverting the river to the eastern edge and eventually making the floodplain habitable by the mid-second century.<sup>31</sup> Evidence from the Brooks excavation of the 1980’s, led by Martin Biddle, indicates that there was habitation on Middle Brook Street in the mid-first century beginning with the building of two timber strip-buildings, which sandwiched a central property with mortar or clay floors and a hearth of packed flints.<sup>32</sup> During the Flavian period of circa 68-98 AD, when the status of *Venta Belgarum* was elevated to that of *civitas*, there is evidence of ‘intensive occupation’ on the higher ground of the tufa, especially in the

The channel running alongside the High Street remained in use until the middle of the 2<sup>nd</sup> century, influencing Scobie, Zant and Whinney to speculate that the wider area, excluding the High Street and Middle Brook Street, was uninhabitable and existed as marshland until the mid-second century. Other buildings of note to be constructed on the raised chalk bar are the basilica and forum, which were most likely located on the current site of the Wessex hotel and the Winchester Cathedral green. vicinity of Middle Brook Street.<sup>33</sup> The population was growing; the defences were strengthened and timber buildings were replaced by, increasingly, non-local stone.<sup>34</sup> A number of buildings were constructed on the street, subsequently demolished, and then rebuilt in a grander fashion, utilising tiles, thatch or shingles for the roofs, daub for walls and lime wash for exteriors. As the community became more established, the timber structures were torn down and replaced by masonry.<sup>35</sup> However, not all of the buildings on the street were obviously domestic dwellings, as is evident by two timber buildings of cill-beam construction, attributed to the middle of the third century with multiple phases of mortar flooring, which could have been used as workshops. The 4.2m wide by 4.9m long and 5.5m wide by 6.5m long buildings were demolished by the early fourth and late third centuries, respectively.<sup>36</sup>

During the almost 350 years of Roman occupation, dramatic changes were made in the positioning of towns and villages, and the roads of new Roman towns assumed an orderly street grid pattern not found in the random development of the older Roman towns. Indeed, Wachter contends that the volume and intensity of changes made in the development of towns during the Roman occupation would not be matched in Britain until the Industrial Revolution.<sup>37</sup> The character of the street changed dramatically with the arrival of people from continental Europe in the fourth century.<sup>38</sup>

It is suggested that, as civic discipline broke down, the remaining residents began to build homes over the streets, particularly on the raised island, due to the well-drained and firm foundation, and Roman property boundaries were ignored.<sup>39</sup> By the time that Roman occupation had ceased in the early fifth century, the area had been substantially modified and developed, creating a template for which the incoming Anglo-Saxons developed even further. However, in the immediate post-Roman period, there is evidence that the water of the Itchen flowed freely through the neglected city streets, reverting to its original pre-historic course and exposing the tufa island as the only possible site for habitation.<sup>40</sup> However, without evidence, we can only assume that the street was relatively uninhabited during this two

hundred year period as Roman structures were dismantled or fell into ruin and the lines of Roman streets became blurred.<sup>41</sup>

## **Saxon Ingenuity and Prosperity**

Little is known of the inhabitants of Winchester, if there were any, after the Romans withdrew. James describes the pagan Saxons as ‘rural people who apparently had no experience of life in urban centres such as Winchester’ and archaeological evidence from the fifth and sixth centuries shows that there is little proof of life within the city walls.<sup>42</sup> Though the population was sparse, there is evidence of habitation in the Brooks area, by a small seventh century cemetery, which contained a high-status grave of a Christian female, and a ninth century stone building on Lower Brook Street, which eventually became the church of St. Mary Tanner Street, contained evidence of gold-working.<sup>43</sup> The site of St. Pancras church on Middle Brook Street contained two burials dated from between the seventh to the tenth centuries and could have been built as a private chapel or for the personal use of a ‘substantial householder’ that lived near the site. However, cemeteries within the urban area were tightly controlled by the end of the seventh century when the Cathedral Priory assumed control of all burials within the city walls.<sup>44</sup>

The arrival of Alfred in the late ninth century, followed by the reign of his son, Edward the Elder (899 - 924) signified a time of immense change, development and growth in Winchester, now named *Wintanceaster* by the Saxons, with the ‘ceaster’ part of the name indicating that the place was recognised as a ‘Roman walled site’.<sup>45</sup> Keene asserts that the tenth century was a period of the city’s greatest growth and the beginning of three hundred years of great prosperity.<sup>46</sup> In the tenth century, and probably before c. 904, the Anglo-Saxons created a rectilinear street plan, retaining the original High Street, and establishing

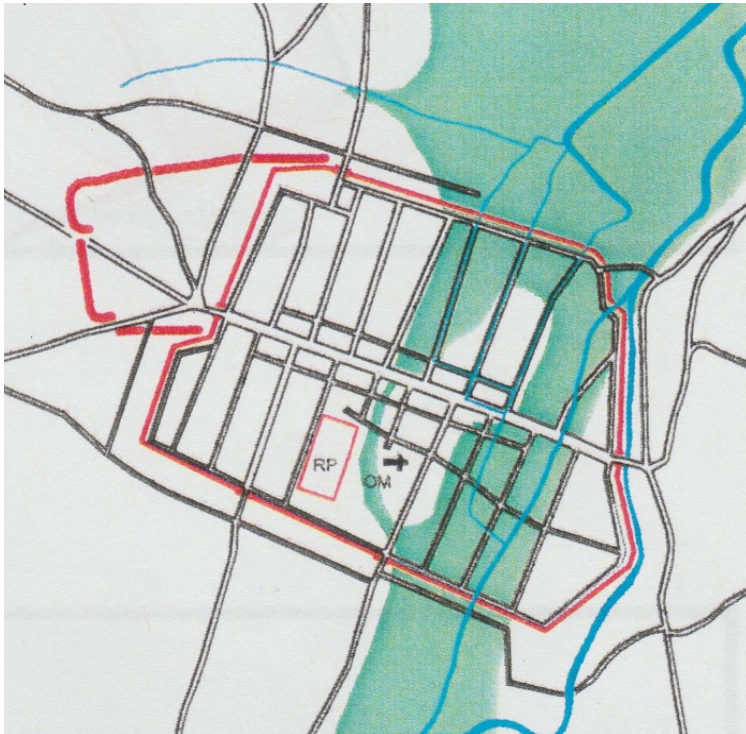

seven streets to the north and seven to the south.<sup>47</sup> The newly established street layout shifted Middle Brook Street slightly to the west of the original Roman road to conform to the standardized distance between the streets, but only varied slightly from the original Roman layout, as did the High Street.<sup>48</sup>

The greatest change for Middle Brook Street, known as *Wunegrestret*, was the tenth century diversion of the River Itchen at Black Ditch, to the north of the city, so that water flowed in a timber-lined channel down the centre of the street.<sup>49</sup> Water channels were also created on Lower Brook Street, or *Tannerestret* (Tanner Street) and Upper Brook Street, referred to as *Sildwortenestret*, ‘shield-makers street’, creating the ‘Brooks’ area of the city, within the protective city walls. Scobie

theorizes that “it would seem likely that the Upper Brook and probably the Lower Brook, were created by the formalisation of existing streams or channels. By contrast, the Middle Brook, which cuts across the higher ‘island’ between the other two streams, is, in part at least, man-made”.<sup>50</sup> There is evidence that canalisation of the Brooks area occurred at different times and to service different areas with the main flow diverted to the east of the city to serve the *Nunnaminster* when the planned street system was established in the late ninth to early tenth century. Upper Brook may have existed as a stream, but was formally canalised to provide clean water to the Royal Palace. While the water channels on Middle and Lower Brook streets, may have been established as part of Bishop Ethelwold’s reforms to provide

water to the Old and New Minsters, and canalised either during the establishment of the street system, or after, but preceding the laying of the street.<sup>51</sup>

The origin of the name *Wunegrestret* possibly derives from the personal name *Winegar*, which was recorded in the boundary mark to *Winagares Stapule* of 1032, hence “Winegar’s Street”.<sup>52</sup> Over the Saxon period, it was known by many similar names *Wungrestret*, *Wengarstret*, and *Wonegarestret*, to name a few, evolving to *Wongar* Street in the later Anglo-Saxon period.<sup>53</sup> In some documents it was also referred to as *Dierstret* in a will of 1361, reflecting the prevalence of dyers located on the street, and *Pancrasstret* in the fifteenth century, alluding to the church of St. Pancras located on the street.<sup>54</sup>

The strengthening of the walls, laying of the rectilinear street plan and canalisation of the Brooks area are considered part of a deliberate plan by Alfred to create not only a fortress, but a ‘fortified town’ with the intention to attract people to settle permanently within the walls.<sup>55</sup> The diversion of the Itchen through the city, rather than around the city, as the Romans had done, provided a constant water supply, not only for the development of water-dependent trades, but perhaps also for use during times of war when residents were barricaded within the walls.

## Medieval Trades and Use of the Water Channel

In the early medieval period, Winchester was a flourishing royal and ecclesiastical capital and thrived on the regional and international trade of wool.<sup>56</sup> Royal and church patronage stimulated the production of large quantities of cloth and leather, crafts and consumables.<sup>57</sup> In addition, Winchester became famous for the yearly St. Giles’ fair, held on St. Giles’ Hill, the eastern slope of the city. In the thirteenth century, it was considered one of the five great fairs in England and attracted merchants from all over Britain and Europe for sixteen days in September.<sup>58</sup> Winchester was clearly a hive of trade activity and the Brooks area thrived due to the abundance of fresh water flowing through the channels that enabled tanners, dyers, butchers, fullers, and other trades to exist within the city walls, rather than in the outlying

villages. This gave the tradesmen an advantage when supplying their wares to the royal household, or at the markets and fairs. The Brooks excavation of 1987-88 indicates that manufacturing did indeed thrive on *Wunegrestret* with the discovery of thousands of shards of Saxon glass, and evidence of clothworking, tanning and metalworking, a defining feature of ‘significant urban communities’ and which distinguishes Winchester from other towns in the Saxon period.<sup>59</sup> Haslam observed that ‘Winchester had a great advantage in the form of running streams, carefully channelled through the lower part of town to supply the clothworkers, dyers, tanners, etc. [In Southampton,] there were no flowing streams, and throughout its history, therefore, the town did not develop its own industries.’<sup>60</sup>

In Winchester, weavers and fullers established craft guilds, attesting to the success of their trades, due to the plentiful water supply of the channels to clean and process wool from Hampshire sheep, as well as ready customers at the great St. Giles’ Fair and throughout Europe, via the port of Southampton.<sup>61</sup> In addition, the monastic community, royal population, and pilgrims visiting relics provided a continuity of consumption. The royal household generated the demand for local craftsmen, supplies of food and clothing for the large staff and steady stream of visitors.<sup>62</sup> But also, diverting the river into channels could have been a way to prevent flooding of the city, as the water table was high in the Brooks section of the town and occasional flooding was likely to be a problem, as we know from more recent floods in the area. In addition, the water channels provided motive power to run several city mills, although there is no evidence that one existed on *Wunegrestret*.<sup>63</sup>

During the eleventh to thirteenth centuries, the street was teeming with storehouses, workshops and dwellings and the name of *Wunegrestret* was shortened to *Wongar Street*. The house of Godwin Soche, master moneyer from 1103-1115, was located on *Wongar Street* and could possibly be the site of a mint, the existence of which was confirmed by King John in 1215, Henry III in 1227, and Edward III in 1344.<sup>64</sup> More of the street was inhabited at this time, except for the north-east section, on which a church and fruit orchards for the precinct of the Friars Minor, or Grey Friars, were located since 1237, when it was bestowed upon the friars by the crown.<sup>65</sup> The land extended from *Wongar Street* to Tanner Street and

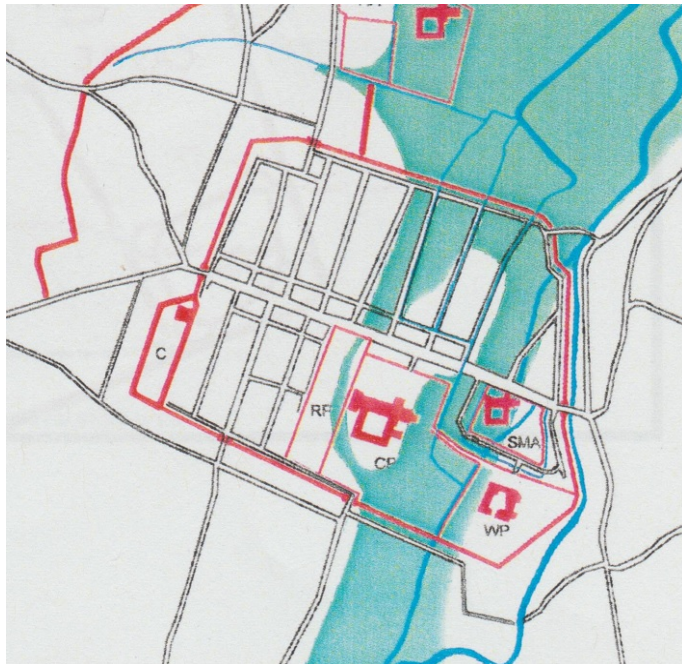

consisted of an orchard, church, and out buildings, which appear to have been demolished by 1543.<sup>66</sup> The prior's lodging remained when Winchester College acquired the property. By

1582 the 'precinct included a barn, a stable, a dovecot, and orchards.'<sup>67</sup> It is unlikely that the Friars Minor chose this property due to the existence of water channels as it was typical for Franciscans to select plots of land which were on the fringes of the built-up area and accessible to the poor, indicating that this area of *Wongar Street* was uninhabited in the thirteenth century.<sup>68</sup>

The residents of *Wongar Street* were a mixture of labourers and tradesmen, as well as wealthy merchants, mayors and aldermen.

John de Tytyng is an example of a wealthy wool merchant and local MP that resided on a property between Upper and Middle Brook streets between 1299 and 1312.<sup>69</sup> Interspersed among higher status dwellings were single-bay cottages, which were much smaller than surviving Hampshire medieval town houses, indicating the density of development and strong demand for housing on *Wongar Street* during the height of occupancy until the later fourteenth century.<sup>70</sup> Interwoven among the *Wongar Street* properties were lanes which helped pedestrians to move quickly throughout the Brooks area and often named after the trade or church for which it was used,

including St. Pancras Lane and *Veleteres*, or Felterer's, Lane. Silver Hill was also described as a lane 'leading from *Wongar Street* to Tanner Street'.<sup>71</sup> Small bridges and planks helped people to cross the streams running not only down the street, but also to individual tenements.

Residents used the water for washing, drinking and cooking and the trades rinsed their animal hides or entrails, washed dyes and fuller's earth out of cloth, and brewers used the clearer water upstream for beer brewing.<sup>72</sup> Some homes diverted the stream even further into their dwellings as a form of indoor plumbing.<sup>73</sup> Hinton observes that many of the trades leave no physical trace of their existence. Instead, the evidence that the wool and cloth trade was prosperous in the Brooks area comes from the existence of properties and workshops next to the water channels, as the trades related to the processing of wool required large amounts of water.<sup>74</sup> The well-preserved remains of a fuller's workshop were unearthed on *Wongar Street*, dating from the mid-twelfth century, originally belonging to Roger the vintner, a wine merchant, and then moving to John Newman, a fuller. The site included tanks, sluices and a drain which were used to soak, wash, and tread cloth to encourage shrinkage and raise the nap.<sup>75</sup> There is no doubt that the abundant supply of water from the channel contributed to this workshop being sited on *Wongar Street*. It is during this time period that the combination of archaeological and documentary evidence provides a broader picture of the development on the street.

Water quality was known to be an issue, as proven by a court case of 1299 between Upper Brook resident Juliana de la Flourde, a washerwoman, and her prosperous merchant neighbour, John de Tytyng, who complained that she was washing dirty clothing, including diapers, in the common stream. The resultant ruling by Edward I, stating that 'water has always been common' and that 'people should not put woad-waste, hides in the course of being tanned, sheepskins, entrails, and human and animal blood' in the river, nor should they have 'garderobes or gutters discharging into the water' was made into law by parliament and became the basis for clean water legislation, eventually adopted by the United Nation's Convention on Human Rights.<sup>76</sup> Unfortunately, during the Middle Ages, the residents regularly ignored the ruling and the water quality of the channels did not improve.

In addition, flooding was a problem and a number of bridges were built and additional channels dug to redirect the water in the Brooks area, made worse by the raising of the High street to avoid flooding. The effect was a rise in ground and water levels with the water in the Tanner street channels rising by two feet between the tenth and fifteenth centuries.<sup>77</sup> As the water flowed downstream it threatened the water supply for the ecclesiastical district of the town. In the 970's, to avoid the fouled water supply from the Brooks, and for sanitary purposes, both King Edgar and Bishop Aethelwold created diversions of the main river to the east of the town to service the New Minster, the monasteries, and Wolvesey Palace.<sup>78</sup> In the eleventh century, lead pipes began to be used to supply water to the bishop's palace and priory.<sup>79</sup> The Brooks channels, however, continued to flow through the city via Colebrook Street and the filth accumulated on the land surrounding Winchester College in the 1300s. William Wykeham insisted that a grille be installed over the stream, requiring the employment of a man to regularly catch "the offending dung, carcasses and putrid entrails" trapped there.<sup>80</sup>

The royal capital moved to London in the thirteenth century and Winchester went into decline due to the loss of royal and noble patronage.<sup>81</sup> Long distance trade slowed and the St. Giles' fair suffered, but archaeological evidence indicates that the regional wool trade continued to thrive with a licensed wool market and active guilds of master weavers and fullers that continued to trade in the south.<sup>82</sup> Aulnage accounts, surviving from 1358 detail a flourishing cloth industry in Winchester, which would continue until the sixteenth century.<sup>83</sup> Trade and craft activity continued on *Wongar* Street and properties were held by fishmongers, millers, skimmers, dyers, fullers and weavers, as well as wool exporters and merchants from 1300 – 1430.<sup>84</sup> As the city grew and contracted, aldermanries were established and modified, depending on the population. In addition, parish boundaries enclosed neighbourhoods, but were sometimes rearranged to adjust for changes in property ownership.<sup>85</sup>

There is evidence of breweries using the clean clear water from the northern-most end of the street for their beers, but as the river flowed south toward the city centre, it became

dirtier as residents and trades dumped their refuse and sewage into the water, regularly also using the water for drinking and household use.<sup>86</sup> The borough court recognised the connection between unclean water and disease and in 1543, made it the responsibility of those that abutted the water to scour the river bed, and fined those trades that dumped their waste. They went even further in 1554 by forcing the Brooks area trades to stop work for the month of May every year to clean the river and you could be imprisoned if you didn't do your part.<sup>87</sup>

The combination of deaths from the Black Death of 1348 and various plagues over time reduced the population in Winchester from its peak of 11,625 in the eleventh century to only 3,000 at the outbreak of the Civil War in 1642.<sup>88</sup> From the fourteenth to seventeenth centuries, the trades and demographics on *Wongar Street* changed in response to the contraction and expansion of the population. During economic prosperity, dwellings and workshops spread out from the centre toward the town walls and the Brooks area was more densely populated. But in times of flooding, famine, outbreaks of the plague and cholera, and economic decline, the inhabitants contracted inward toward the High Street and onto the drier land of the raised island, abandoning the outlying dwellings and workshops.<sup>89</sup> Both Speed's map of 1611 and Milne's map of 1791 show much of the property toward the north wall as farmland and orchards during this time of decline, with the occupation grouped closer to the town centre.<sup>90</sup>

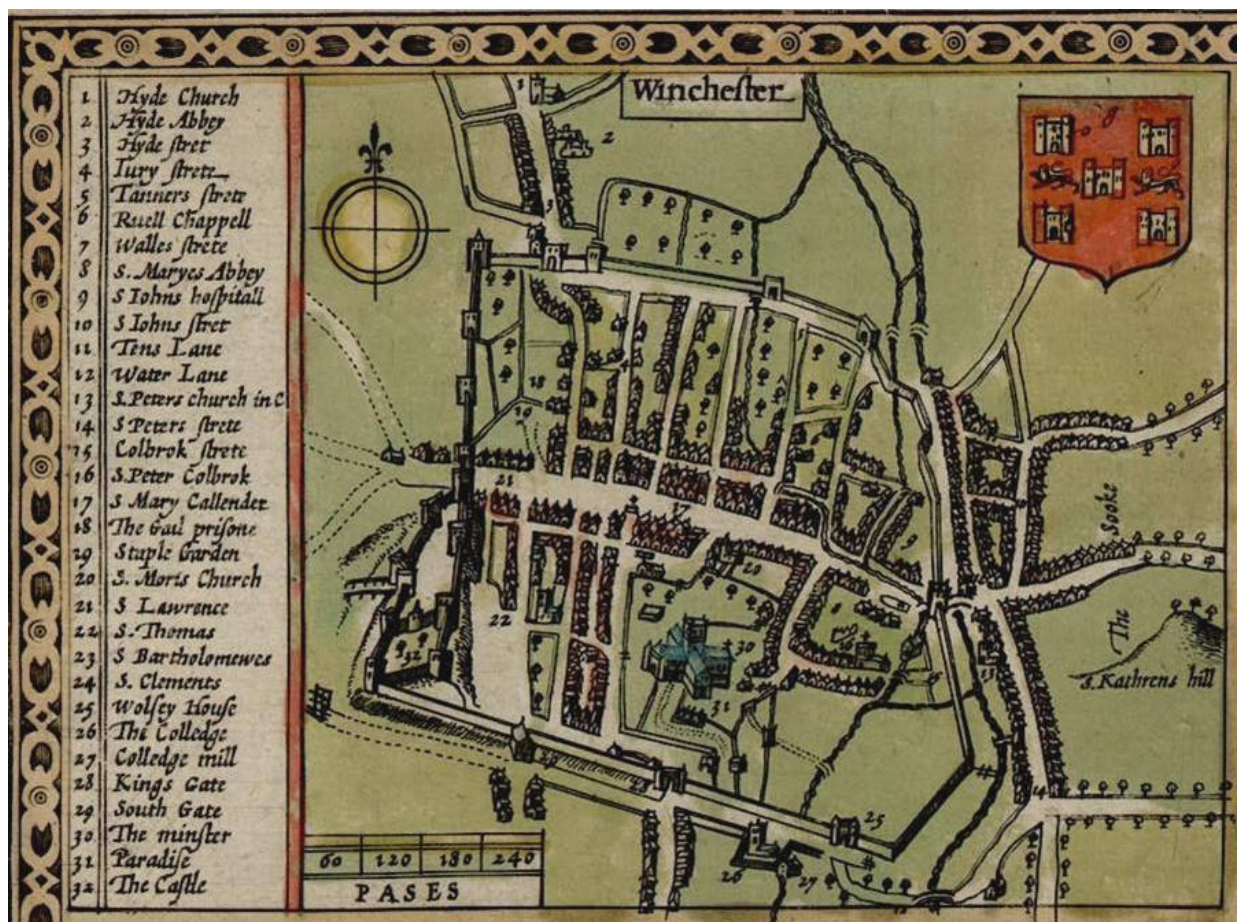

Winchester in the 18<sup>th</sup> century, with a population of approximately 4000, was a relatively quiet market town, compared to the projected peak of 11,625 in the Middle Ages.<sup>91</sup> The Brooks area remained the poor section of the city and struggled with water quality issues, especially after the Royal Hampshire County Hospital was moved from Colebrook Street to Parchment Street in 1753.<sup>92</sup> The hospital had a piped water supply, but no sewer pipes to carry away the overflow from their cesspool, resulting in the detritus of the hospital and waste from homes on higher ground draining to the lowest point in the river valley, namely the Brooks.<sup>93</sup> In 1766 the Paving Commission was established to pave, light and clean the streets and enacted regulations that restricted where butchers could slaughter animals. Sheep, pigs and cows were not allowed to wander, a public scavenger was appointed, and bog

houses were not allowed to dump refuse into the Brooks, but were ordered to use the main river.<sup>94</sup> However, the regulations were apparently not effective over the long term.

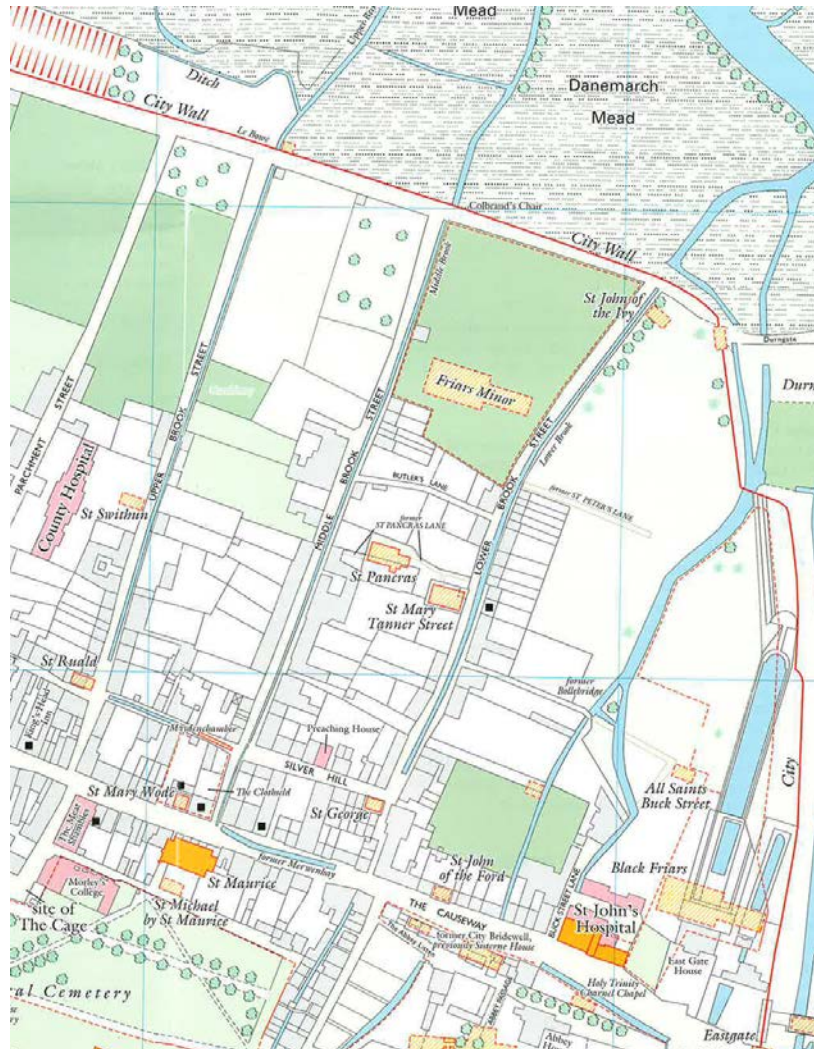
The long history of Middle Brook Street from the Roman to the early modern periods has been studied in depth and major archaeological excavations have furthered our understanding of the trades and buildings located on the street. Using this information as a contextual base, the next chapters will seek to continue the study into the modern period, when, after one thousand years of existence, the water channel that gave Middle Brook Street its name becomes but a memory.

## CHAPTER 2

### NINETEENTH CENTURY POPULATION CHANGES

This chapter is an analysis of the population of Middle Brook Street from 1801 to 1911, with a focus on the years 1841 to 1911 due to the availability of data on the Brooks area and Middle Brook Street, in particular, in the decennial censuses of this time period. The aim is to analyse who lived on the street; their gender, age, marital status, occupation, family and household structures, and birthplace. Combined with overall population statistics, the data provides a comprehensive character-study of Middle Brook Street in the nineteenth and early twentieth centuries during a time of transition when the defining feature of the water channel was removed. Further analysis continues in chapter three, in which the occupations of

residents are examined to determine if the removal of the water channel impacted on the types of work of the residents and, if so, how.

### **Sanitation Issues Come to a Head**

The population of Winchester in the 1800s grew rapidly and almost tripled in size by the end of the century.<sup>95</sup> The Industrial Revolution, during which a new railway line connecting Winchester to Southampton, Basingstoke and London was opened in 1839 - 1840, brought new prosperity to the area, resulting in the building of grand houses on Clifton Terrace and St James' Terrace on the western slope and St. Giles Hill on the eastern.<sup>96</sup> In addition, small tenements, similar to the ones located in the Brooks, were built outside of the West Gate. However, these homes did not benefit from the Brooks' water supply in case of fire. The cost of laying pipes, estimated at £1220 by the city surveyor, was prohibitive, as the Pavement Commissioners did not have any funds. An entrepreneurial resident, Mr Robbin, who was the proprietor of the steam engine in St. James' Field, offered 'to provide a gratuitous supply of water in case of fire on condition that he be allowed to use mains to convey water to the houses of individuals for domestic purposes'.<sup>97</sup> His offer was rewarded by the Pavement Commissioners who granted permission for Mr Robbin to 'lay down main and service pipes to any part of the city and suburbs for supplying water to the inhabitants for public and domestic purposes, from his waterworks in St James's Field', as long as he gave the Pavement Commissioners permission to insert fire plugs.<sup>98</sup>

Additionally, large institutional buildings were being constructed higher up on the terraces, including the New Workhouse at Oram's Arbour in 1834-5.<sup>99</sup> There began an exodus to the West Hill with the county prison and police station moving to Romsey Road in 1849, followed by the Diocesan Training College in 1862 and finally the county hospital in 1868.<sup>100</sup> All were attempting to escape the noxious fumes, streets filled with refuse, and disease in the city. In the medieval period, the inhabitants of the Brooks included 'the masters as well as the men and some of the masters ranked among the leading citizens'.<sup>101</sup>

However, in the nineteenth century, if one could afford the large new homes on Clifton Terrace, St. James' Lane and St. Giles' Hill, it was considered healthier and safer to live there. The new buildings and homes on the eastern and western terraces benefitted from piped water, but no provision was made for proper drainage, other than individual cesspools, which frequently overflowed. Therefore, even more human and animal waste flowed downwards into the Brooks area.<sup>102</sup> Boorman explains that this resulted in a lost opportunity for large institutions to contribute to the betterment of the city and, instead, they allowed their 'effluent to drain down into the unfortunate city below where the situation deteriorated.'<sup>103</sup> It is ironic that the hospital, the sole purpose of which is to treat and cure residents of illness, created health problems instead.

The Brooks area in the early 1800s was a crowded slum of tenements and workshops and the water channels contained refuse and sewage. Sanitary conditions were so bad that the life expectancy in the Brooks area in 1850 was only 42 years, compared to an average of 50 years in Winchester and 58 years in England as a whole.<sup>104</sup> In addition, the population of the city was growing, especially in the civil parish of St Maurice, which contained Middle Brook Street.<sup>105</sup> The Brooks offered small inexpensively built tenements to agricultural and building labourers who worked in the country or on new construction during the day.<sup>106</sup> It is conjectured by Boorman that more efficient machinery on farms reduced the need for agricultural labourers and contributed to the influx of new residents to the Brooks, rather than the introduction of the railway to Winchester.<sup>107</sup> In either case, the population of the Brooks swelled and sanitation became an even greater issue. The problem was not uncommon in the rest of Britain. The Avon Street district in Bath faced 'constant pollution of the river from sewage and industrial waste from breweries and tanneries, the use of the river water to "cleanse" the streets, as well as frequent inundations from floods'.<sup>108</sup> Salisbury suffered from epidemics every few years from the sixteenth to the nineteenth centuries due to open water channels and 'refuse-laden streets', but the population remained constant because of an endless supply of immigrants.<sup>109</sup> Luckin asserts that pollution 'undoubtedly afflicted all

those places in which demographic growth during the late eighteenth and early nineteenth centuries was unusually rapid, in-migration heavy and the poorest members of the community subject to exceptionally high levels of overcrowding'.<sup>110</sup>

Pavement Commissioners had been appointed in the 1770s, but by the 1830s, it was clear that the scale of the problem was so great that it was beyond their ability to control, thereby passing their powers on to the Corporation in 1835.<sup>111</sup> In 1849 The Rev Dr Moberly, headmaster of Winchester College, was appointed chair of a committee to consider 'the sewerage and drainage of the city and suburbs.'<sup>112</sup> His proposal to drain part of the town, with the financial help of 'those institutions in the city that which did not pay rates, such as the County Hospital, the dean and Chapter, and the College' was rejected, but his description of the Brooks area illustrates the dire situation:

In some localities, for instance, there are open and offensive ditches, drains, gutters, gratings, and other outlets, constantly emitting noxious effluvia, and contaminating both the air and water which the inhabitants are under the necessity of using. Of the open gutters running from private premises into the streets, some proceed from the slaughter-houses, stables, pigsties, sculleries, and other out-buildings, the liquid refuse of which must of necessity be of an offensive nature.<sup>113</sup>

The deplorable state of the Brooks area could not be ignored and a long battle ensued between the Anti-Muckabites, led by local doctors and scholars, who sought to build a sewer system, versus the Muckabites, who resisted spending public funds and were not convinced that an underground sewer would prevent disease. This same battle was being fought in other cities with water channels. In Salisbury, for example, the medical officer to the Overseers to the Poor, John Winzar, argued that the watercourses should be retained, as 'neither nature nor art could possibly have formed channels better adapted for carrying away the sewage of the city'.<sup>114</sup> It was long believed that cholera and other diseases were carried by 'foul air', rather than water, and it was not until after the creation of Civil Registrations of Deaths in 1835, which provided statistics and causes of death, that water was accepted as the killer.<sup>115</sup> In addition, John Snow's 1854 mapping of the spread of cholera in the Soho district of London

supported the theory that contaminated water was the culprit for the spread of the disease, tracing the 1848 outbreak to one single contaminated pump on Broad Street.<sup>116</sup>

The Anti-Muckabites, also called ‘Drainists’ or ‘Sewerites’ fought for the health of all, especially the poor, rather than the few who could afford to move to higher ground. Even the return of Cholera in 1849 could not persuade voters to approve a sewer system for the city because none of the 35 deaths from the disease occurred above the Upper Brooks.<sup>117</sup> It was not until 1875 that parliamentary legislation forced the Winchester Corporation to build sewers with a pumping station at Garnier Road and the water that had flowed for over one thousand years through the streets finally went underground.<sup>118</sup>

### Who Lived on the Street? – Census Reports

Census reports from 1801 to 1911 provide varying details of the population, some of which is unreliable, and the information compiled is inconsistent.<sup>119</sup> For example, the censuses from 1801 to 1831 do not contain demographic detail of residents and only overall data by parish. However, by comparing parish information, it is possible to determine that two of the parishes within the walled city with the greatest increase in population between 1801 and 1821 are St Maurice and St Mary Kalendar, which grew by 20 per cent between 1801 to 1811 and then another 20 per cent by 1821.<sup>120</sup> The Brooks area represented a significant portion of St Maurice parish, with approximately 90 per cent of Middle Brook Street located in this parish and the balance in St Mary Kalendar.<sup>121</sup> Additionally, in comparison to the 1851-1911

censuses, the 1841 census does not include house numbers, indicators of head of household and family relationships, nor marital status.<sup>122</sup> Furthermore, lodgers and boarders are not identified and birthplace is listed as either ‘Southampton County’ or ‘other’.<sup>123</sup> However, when William Farr, superintendent of statistics, became a commissioner for the census in 1851, he drew on his medical background to broaden the demographic detail in ensuing censuses. Using the results, along with the civil registrations of deaths, he was able to ‘plot the incidence and developmental laws of epidemic diseases’, which was ‘of great importance for the public health and sanitation movements of the period.’<sup>124</sup> His belief that the higher concentration of residents in an area due to rapid urbanisation created larger quantities of effluent, resulting in the spread of disease and a higher death rate.<sup>125</sup>

The population of Middle Brook Street did not maintain the same proportion of growth and decline as the population of Winchester as a whole. In 1841, for example, the 231 residents of Middle Brook Street accounted for 2.3 per cent of the total population of Winchester, which stood at 9,889 residents.<sup>126</sup> However, by 1851, during a period of intense growth in the city, the percentage of residents on Middle Brook Street more than doubled to 5.61 per cent of the total population of Winchester, housing 696 residents of the city’s total of 12,402.<sup>127</sup> In 1861, although the population in Winchester increased a further 19 per cent, the population of Middle Brook Street decreased to 621 residents, which is 4.2 per cent of the population of Winchester.<sup>128</sup> This downward trend continued, with 584 residents of the street comprising 3.38 per cent of Winchester in 1871, 536 residents, or 2.72 per cent in 1891, 517 residents, or 2.57 per cent in 1901 and then finally settling just above the 1841 proportion at 2.44 per cent in 1911 with the number of residents on the street totalling 571.<sup>129</sup>

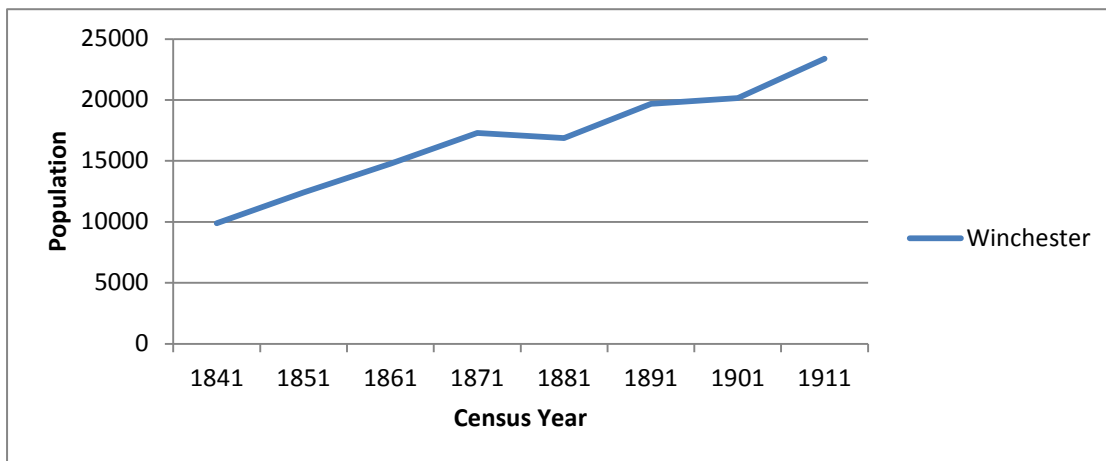

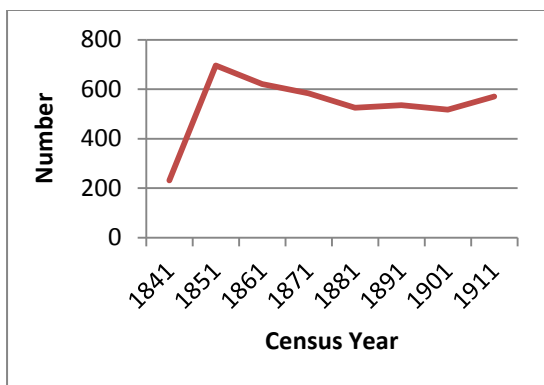

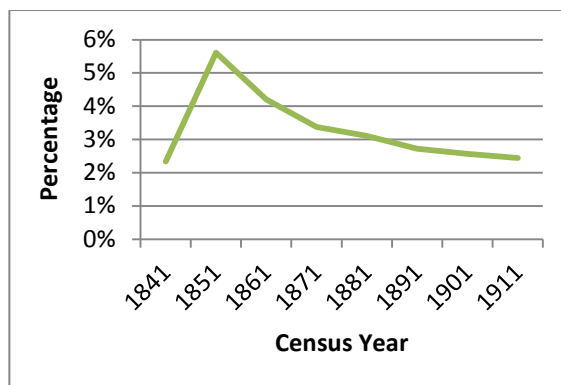


**Figure 7** - Population Fluctuations of Middle Brook Street compared to Winchester

Figure 7 indicates that the population growth of Middle Brook Street was relatively flat compared to the upward trend of Winchester as a whole. However, when the figures for Middle Brook Street are enlarged (Figures 8 and 9), it is obvious that there was substantial growth in the early part of the study period.

It was during this expansion in the 1840’s that the high density tenements of Freeland Buildings, Albert Place, Poulson’s Place and the Prince’s Buildings were built, contributing to ‘the most rapid growth of population for any of the decades from 1801-71 in the two parishes that included this area – St. Maurice and St. Mary Kalendar.’<sup>130</sup> The initial doubling of the population of Middle Brook Street between 1841 and 1851 appears to level off until

1911, but the population of Winchester continued to grow by 500-1500 per decade.<sup>131</sup> One possible explanation for the comparatively mild fluctuations is that the street had a limited

amount of space in which to expand, but the Winchester district was able to spread out beyond the city walls into the suburbs. There was some open space on the north east end of the street previously owned by the Grey Friars, as is evident in the map in Figure 10, but at this point it was owned by Winchester College and undeveloped. British artist Michael Angelo Rooker painted a bucolic scene of the ruins of the Greyfriars monastery around 1790 – 1795, depicting farm labourers gathering hay. On the north west side of the street, Holy Trinity church was built in open space in 1854.<sup>132</sup>



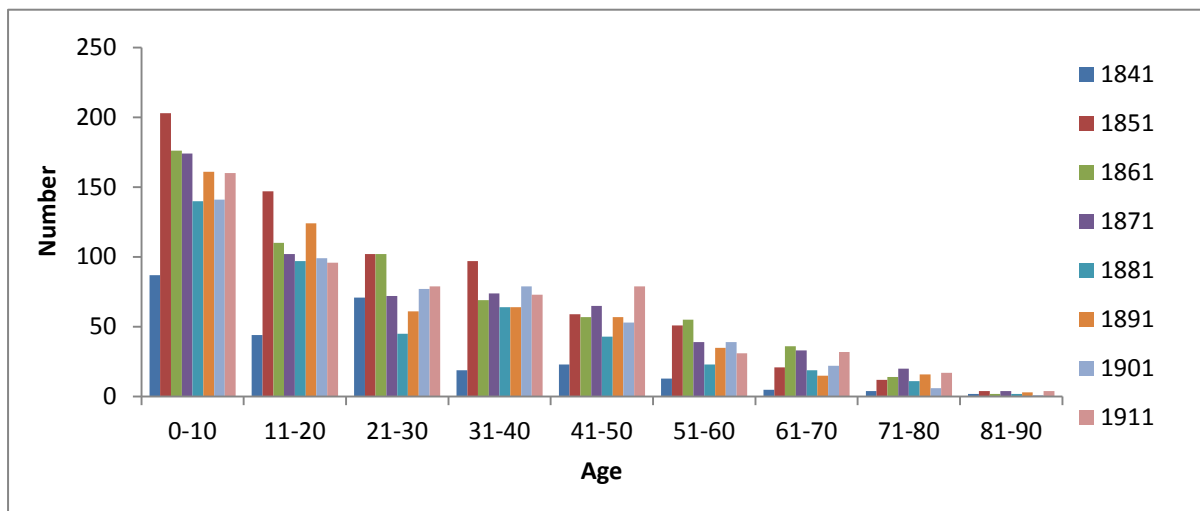
**Figure 11** – ‘Chapel of the Greyfriars Monastery, Winchester’, painted by Michael Angelo Rooker<sup>133</sup>

## Age and Gender

It is clear from Figure 12, that when the influx of new residents began in the 1840s, that they brought with them a large number of children, as well. There are multiple instances of extended families living together, including nieces and nephews and grandchildren. The

average number of children in an extended family, in 1871 was 3.88.<sup>134</sup> In 1851 and 1861, 36 per cent of the residents on the street were children aged 14 and under, by 1871, the number had grown to 40 per cent, but then dropped to 35 per cent in 1881.<sup>135</sup> In 1891 it increased again to 38 per cent, but then decreased in 1901 dipping to 34 per

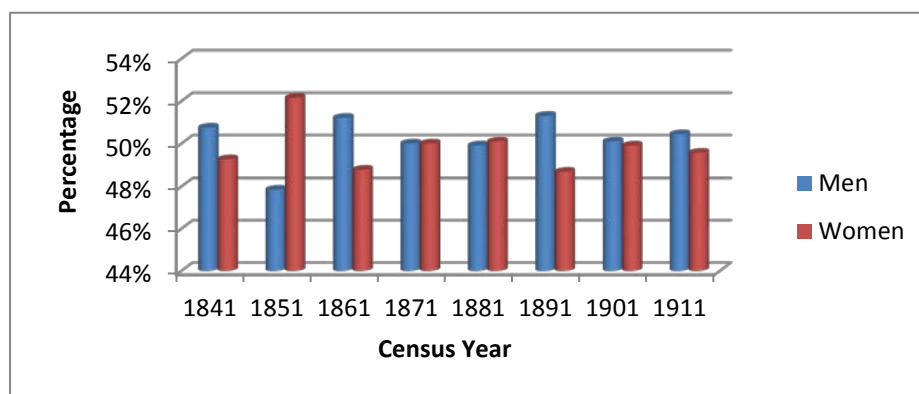
cent by 1911.<sup>136</sup> The rise and fall of number of children may be due to a number of social factors, according to Sian Pooley, including the evolution of the theory of a child’s role within a family from earner to cherished youth, and the introduction of compulsory education in 1881, which became free in 1891, thereby removing children from the workforce and affecting the ‘perceived relative costs of child-rearing’.<sup>137</sup> Figure 13 illustrates the level of activity on the street and high number of children. The image, taken in the late 1800s and after the water channel was culverted, conveys a sense of community, the children appear healthy and well-dressed, and the street looks clean and well-maintained. The high number of children, and the previously mentioned low average lifespan of 42 years in 1850 in the Brooks resulted in a young population, with men decidedly younger than women, possibly the result high levels of female widows.

The national average gender ratio in the nineteenth and early twentieth century was 49 men to 51 women.<sup>138</sup> The gender analysis of residents of Middle Brook Street has been divided into two sections; the first representing all age groups and the second representing age 14 and beyond, representing those that have completed their education and have entered the workforce.



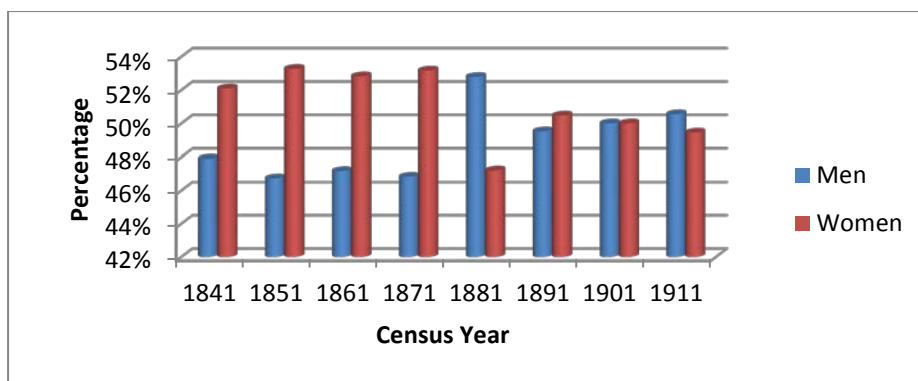
**Figure 15** - All age groups

Focusing on those in the workforce (Figure 16), it is notable that there are more women than men between the years 1841 to 1871, with women accounting for 52–53 per cent of the adult population.<sup>139</sup> However, in real numbers this equates to only seven more women than men in 1841, 28 in 1851, and 23 in 1861 and 1871. The higher percentage of women may be due to a number of factors; the strenuous nature of the work that the men undertook, as opposed to the women, which will be discussed more fully in the next chapter, and the existence of four pubs on Middle Brook Street alone in 1851, growing to seven pubs in 1861, frequented more by men.<sup>140</sup> The percentages also correlate with the numbers of female heads of households at the same time.

## Household structure

Heads of households are not noted in the 1841 census and therefore the 1841 census is removed from Figure 17.<sup>141</sup> In 1851, 21 per cent of the heads of households were women.<sup>142</sup> Of these, 14 per cent were widows, with an average age of 48.5, again possibly due to the high number of male labourers in high risk jobs, such as building or stonemasonry, as well as the epidemics and diseases due to the open water channels. In 1861, women made up 19.6 per cent of heads, and in 1871, it was higher at 27 per cent, with 19 per cent of the women being widows but with a more reasonable average age of 59.4 years.<sup>143</sup> In 1881, the percentage of female heads of households decreased to 16.7, with 14 per cent widows, however, the average age of the widows again dropped to 50.8 years.<sup>144</sup>

To determine the average household size is quite problematic as the definition of a ‘household’ in the census during the study period was not clarified until 1901 and different interpretations were used every census.<sup>145</sup> In 1901, however, enumerators were instructed to indicate the ‘Head’ and that the ‘family’ was to include ‘a man, his wife and children (if any), also any relatives, visitors, servants, and persons boarding with the family and residing together under one roof’<sup>146</sup> It was also decided that ‘Lodgers’ were given their own definition of ‘Head’ ‘for a lodger (with or without family) separately occupying a room or rooms, and not boarding with any family in the house’.<sup>147</sup> Therefore, those that had previously been included in a family unit were now separated into their own unit, increasing the number of heads of households. However, this instruction was not followed by the enumerators recording the Brooks area of Winchester. Lodgers continued to be considered part of the household that shared the tenement. Perhaps this was due to the fact that there existed so many lodgers, including up to fourteen in The Bricklayer’s Arms pub, which also served as a lodging house.<sup>148</sup> It was common for families in the Brooks area to take in lodgers and boarders for additional income and pubs and inns became boarding houses, as well. In 1891, Elizabeth Clayton, who was a widow with four teenaged children, squeezed an additional eight boarders into their four rooms.<sup>149</sup> Moreover, Allen explains that census night, ‘usually held in late March or early April, was not necessarily the best time of year to observe lodging – most short term tourists will be found in Winchester during the summer, and so the demand for lodgings was not likely to be at its maximum.’<sup>150</sup> The lodgers that are listed during the census, however, would tend to be those that have resided there for more than one week.<sup>151</sup>

Lodgers, boarders, servants and visitors are not considered part of the 'family unit', hence, the family size has been calculated after they have been removed.

The decline in family size from 1851 to 1871 could be explained by the relatively high death rate of residents of the Brooks while sanitation issues remained unresolved. Victorian families had many children because the survival rate was low, especially in the poor areas of Winchester where residents drank from the same water that contained sewage. The sizes of families in 1881 and 1891 were not higher than the average Victorian family, many of whom consisted of 10 or more children.<sup>152</sup> However, when one considers that in 1891, 57 per cent of the residents of the street lived in four rooms or less, along with lodgers and boarders who brought in extra money, it appears crowded, although not overly so.<sup>153</sup> The average family size in England in 1900 was 3.5, which is noticeably lower than Middle Brook Street.<sup>154</sup>

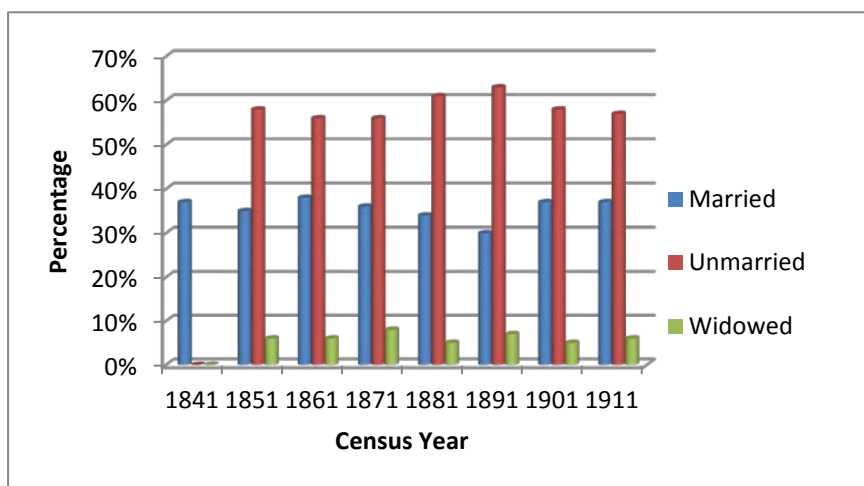
## Marital Status

The marital status of residents has been examined in two different ways; firstly understanding the statistics of those who have finished their education, entered the working world, and begun to marry, and then comparing it to the marital status of all ages. The age of majority in the nineteenth century was twenty-one. However, there are several eighteen- to twenty-year old young women listed as married in the census of this period. Therefore, those from age 18 will be considered in the former group.

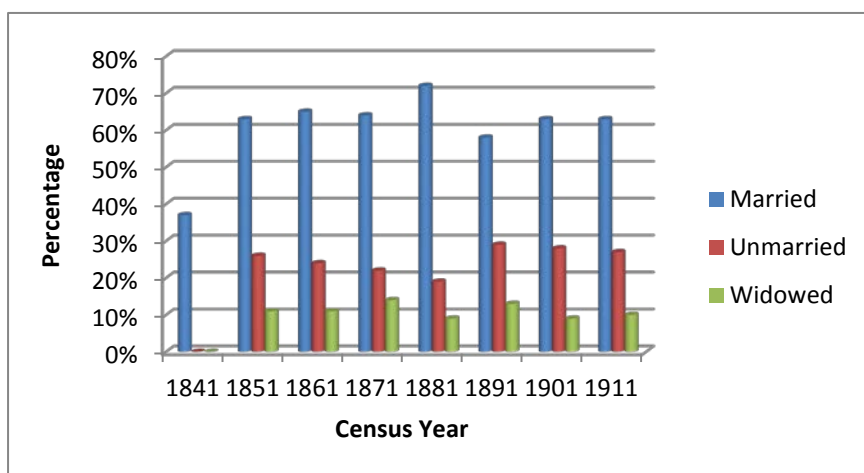

Amongst the adult grouping in Figure 20, it is evident that the majority are married, exceeding the unmarried by an average of thirty-seven per cent, except for the year 1881, in which those that were married exceeded the unmarried adults by fifty-three per cent. This could be due the influx of general labourers working in the building trade, as well as the smaller increases in peripheral trades related to construction, such as carpentry, plastering and plumbing.<sup>155</sup> In 1891, the ratio of married couples was lower than the average at twenty-nine per cent, possibly attributable to the numbers of residents moving to the better quality

working class houses in the suburbs of Weeke, Winnall and Fullood.<sup>156</sup> By 1911, there were over four thousand living in the civil parish of Weeke.<sup>157</sup> In such a small sampling as one street in a city, a few additional residents can make a great impact on the statistics. Finally the ratio returned to 35-36 per cent for 1901 and 1911.<sup>158</sup>

## Birthplace

In 1841, 97 per cent of the residents of Middle Brook Street were from 'Southampton County', which, at that time, was also referred to as the Ancient County of Hampshire and Isle of Wight and encompassed the Isle of Wight, Bournemouth, and Southampton to the south, reaching toward Salisbury on the west and almost touching Reading to the north.<sup>159</sup> No more detail regarding their birthplace was requested of residents in 1841.<sup>160</sup> Edward Higgs explains that the subject of one's birthplace was a complicated question. It was not unusual for a person to be unaware of where they were born, or to choose the earliest location in which they remember living. In addition, the Poor Law required that a resident prove 'settlement' in the parish in which they resided. To ensure that they would receive benefits, inhabitants sometimes recorded their current residence as their birthplace.<sup>161</sup> This phenomenon is an example of the flaws of the data in the census and Higgs believes that it 'tends to reduce the overall level of migration shown in the census, and should be borne in mind by historians when discussing population movements in this period.'<sup>162</sup>

Between 85-91 percent of the residents of Middle Brook Street migrated to Winchester from within Hampshire or from neighbouring counties.<sup>163</sup> According to E.G. Ravenstein, this type of 'short-range migration' was common in rural areas in the Victorian period.<sup>164</sup> Analysis of the 1871 census by Tom Beaumont James revealed that the population of Winchester was predominantly local with 'sixty-seven per cent born in Hampshire, of whom thirty-seven per cent were born in Winchester'.<sup>165</sup> However, analysis of Middle Brook Street shows an even larger population that migrated from the local area, with eighty-three per cent arriving from within Hampshire and sixty-one per cent born in

Winchester.<sup>166</sup> James notes that three-quarters of the population ‘were born within the city, or within a day’s walk of Winchester’, which is roughly 20 miles.<sup>167</sup> This calculation corresponds with data from Middle Brook Street, as well. Irish widows and male and female labourers, settled in Winchester, also working as domestic servants, charwomen and laundresses, representing almost three per cent of the population of the street in 1891.

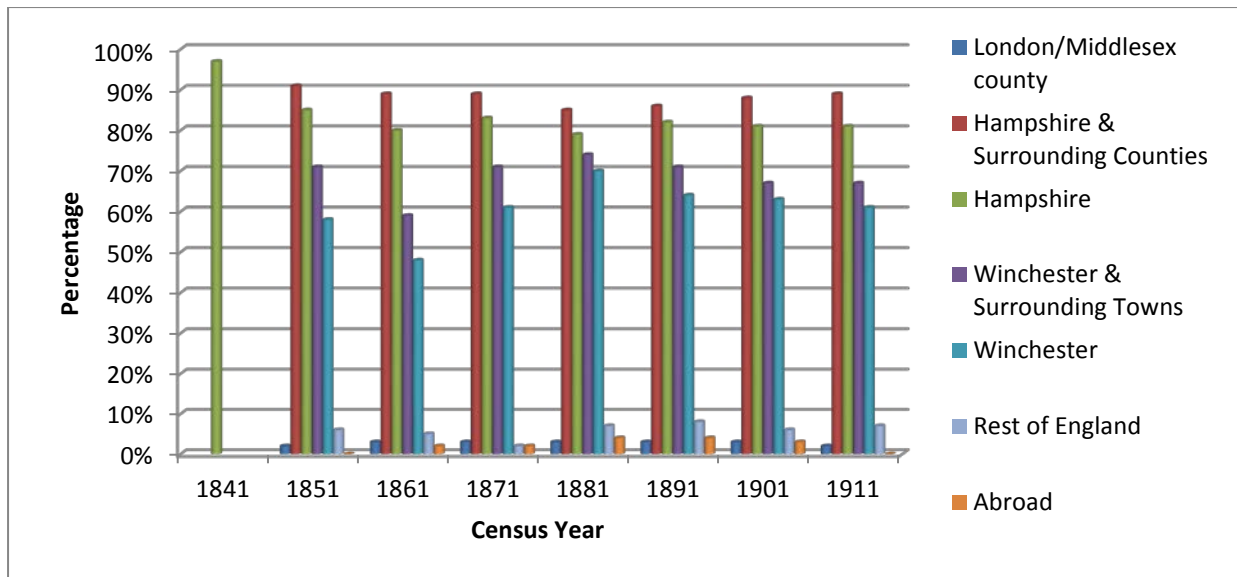
**Figure 21** - Place of Birth by Percentage

Ravenstein devised a series of ‘laws’ of migration, which Mills and Schurer describe as ‘hypotheses to be tested’.<sup>168</sup> His ‘laws’ state that ‘the natives of towns are less migratory than those of rural areas’ and ‘the majority of migration is over short distances, but migrants with higher skills move over much longer distances’.<sup>169</sup> It is possible that the migration patterns of the residents of Middle Brook Street were more local due to the nature of their occupations. Tradesmen and labourers were common working-class occupations that existed in every region across the country. Therefore, one would remain in their locality if there was work available rather than travel distances to compete with those in other areas.

In conclusion, the nineteenth century was a period of rapid change and growth in Winchester that affected Middle Brook Street in the form of a dramatic population rise, especially between 1841 and 1851, the building of high-density tenements which held larger than average households, and sanitary issues resulting from the misuse of the water supply by residents of the Brooks as well as run-off from grander homes on higher ground. Building on this body of evidence, the next chapter will examine the occupations of residents and buildings on the street to further the analysis of the demographics and character of the street. In particular, water-dependent trades are explored to determine how, and if, they were affected when the water was culverted.

## CHAPTER 3

### **NINETEENTH AND EARLY TWENTIETH CENTURY OCCUPATIONS, BUILDINGS AND THE CHARACTER OF THE STREET.**

The occupations of the residents of Middle Brook Street in the nineteenth century were very different from those leading up to the Industrial Revolution. A few lingering remnants of past trades remained in the Brooks in the eighteenth century with production of parchment continuing on Parchment Street as late as 1841, and trades related to water-dependent trades, such as shoemakers, continued to thrive on Middle Brook Street.<sup>170</sup> But residents now primarily used the water for cooking, washing, drinking and to flush away human and animal waste by diverting the streams into their homes.

This chapter examines the occupations listed on the street in the 1841-1911 censuses to identify the predominant occupations and how they change over the time period. In particular, occupations that utilised the water channels will be highlighted to explore the implications of removing the water source. For comparison, the known occupations of residents on the street in the Saxon and Medieval periods are also listed from documentary evidence compiled by Keene. The resulting long-term documentation of known occupations practised by residents provides an opportunity to analyse the relationship between the trades and the water channel and examine the evolution of occupations in a city centre environment. The result of analysis of Keene's Survey is found in APPENDIX 9, which summarises the trades practiced by residents from the years 1000 to roughly 1800 to provide context, with water-dependent occupations highlighted.<sup>171</sup>

### **Occupational Classification**

The Booth-Armstrong system of categorisation, originally developed by Charles Booth in 1886 and then modified by W.A. Armstrong between 1801 to 1851 has been used as the methodology to analyse the occupations of residents on the street from 1841-1911.<sup>172</sup> Other systems are widely used, such as the Tillott's classification scheme, but it was designed primarily for rural communities.<sup>173</sup> Booth-Armstrong has become the basis for social

historical research and was initially developed as an ‘occupational scheme biased toward the study of mortality based on environmental causes, especially in the sub-sections where material handled became the prominent feature.’<sup>174</sup> The main classifications for the system include ten major categories: agriculture, mining, building, manufacture, transport, dealing, industrial service, public service and professional sector, domestic service and the residual population.

In 1970, W.A. Armstrong provided a detailed breakdown of Booth’s occupational groupings with the headings that fell into each category.<sup>175</sup> These groupings have been applied to the censuses of 1841 to 1911 on Middle Brook Street and the body of evidence is presented in APPENDIX 10 with a key to the headings used in APPENDIX 11. To achieve this, each census was distilled to the residents of Middle Brook Street, and then sorted into occupational groupings by job description. As there were variations in description, it was necessary to identify which category best fit the occupation. For example, a carrier for a wine merchant could fit into the grouping of ‘Dealers’ or into the ‘Transport’ grouping. As the occupation description explicitly stated that the carrier worked for a wine merchant, it was decided that the specific grouping of ‘Dealer: wines, spirits, hotels’ was more appropriate than the general ‘Transport: roads’, which included road maintenance. However, if a carrier stated that they were a ‘general carrier’, their occupation would better fit into the ‘Transport’ category.

Eighteenth century analysis is not included in the spreadsheet of known occupations due to the lack of detailed information for residents of the street. Stedman’s research on the late eighteenth and early nineteenth century using ‘local newspapers, the *Universal British Directory*, *Sadler’s* county directory and various local government records like the Book of Ordinances, that was used to trace evidence of building’ enabled him to identify 17 occupational groups.<sup>176</sup> However, the sources that were used favoured the city’s eminent citizens; the more lowly occupations, like the ones practised in the Brooks area, cannot be traced.<sup>177</sup> Allen, using Stedman’s study and census returns, identified common occupations found in the Brooks area from 1801 to 1831, which included those in domestic service,

dealers, shopkeepers and innkeepers.<sup>178</sup> Few agricultural labourers were listed in the 1830 directory in the agriculture section, however, Allen asserts that ‘a great number of people involved in agriculture were labourers’.<sup>179</sup> Some of the trades that may have used the water channels in their processes; butchers, brewers and shoemakers, are represented during this time, but tanners, dyers, and fullers are not mentioned.<sup>180</sup>

## Occupation Statistics

The censuses, beginning in 1841, indicated that the occupations on the street became more diverse and evolved with the needs of the city. As the population of Winchester grew, additional housing and institutional buildings were needed. In 1841, Middle Brook Street was home to seventeen men in the building trades, rising to 41 men in 1851 and peaking at 51 builders in 1861.<sup>181</sup> Even larger numbers of ‘general labourers’ lived on the street, perhaps supporting the building trade or working multiple jobs. The workers required food and drink, resulting in a large number of butchers with nine recorded in the 1871 census.<sup>182</sup> In 1861, nine residents specified that they worked in a bakery, and by 1881, bakeries also sold luxury items created by confectioners and pastry chefs.<sup>183</sup> The location of the Trinity Bakery at 40 Middle Brook Street retained its identity and is now named The Old Bakery Yard. In total, bakers, butchers, dairymen, tea, fish, fruit and vegetable dealers made up 10.5 per cent of the working population and almost 5 per cent of the total population of the street in 1861.<sup>184</sup>

Trade directories, such as White’s *Directory*, listed 120 establishments providing hospitality services in Winchester in 1859, ranging from taverns, inns, and hotels, with one quarter of them beer houses, and Middle Brook Street had its share.<sup>185</sup> In 1841, there were three named pubs on the street, but the number grew as the population doubled, reaching a total of seven pubs by 1861, with the names The Bee Hive Inn, the Cart and Horses Inn, Winton Ale House, Old House at Home, The Robin Hood, and two pubs, The Grapes and The Hope, that appear to be replaced by The John Barleycorn pub by 1871. By 1881, the

Duke of Wellington pub joined the group and the name of the Cart and Horses had been changed to The Bricklayer's Arms to reflect the strong presence of builders in the neighbourhood, with 4 per cent of the total population in Winchester and on Middle Brook Street working as bricklayers.<sup>186</sup> A number of the pubs also served as lodging houses, with two nearby pubs, the Bricklayer's Arms and Old House at Home taking over the tenement between them to lodge a total of 49 people in 1901.<sup>187</sup> In 1909, the Bee Hive Inn and Duke of Wellington closed, with five pubs remaining in 1911.<sup>188</sup>

After the Dependent classes, the largest sub-group was indoor Domestic service, which included institutional servants. Servants are frequently listed on the censuses, but it is difficult to ascertain if they are a relative working as a servant at home or if they were working in the service of others.<sup>189</sup> In either case, the existence of servants indicates the desire to climb the social ladder and raise a family's status. Domestic servants listed in the censuses include cook, hair dresser, laundry, nursemaid, and valet, with general domestic servants accounting for 6.6 per cent of the population in 1851.<sup>190</sup> The young found steady employment as messengers and errand boys, and as the wealth of the city grew, many found employment as domestic servants with 23 listing this occupation in the 1911 census, as compared to only 3 in 1901.<sup>191</sup>

The next most populous occupations included the building trades; bricklayers, stone masons, carpenters, sawyers and plasterers made up 12 per cent of all working residents in 1851 then peaked at 16.7 per cent in 1861, returning to 12 per cent in 1871 and then declining to 7.6 per cent in 1881, 8.8 per cent in 1891, raising again to 13.8 per cent in 1901 and declining again to 8 per cent in 1911.<sup>192</sup> It is evident from the 1841 census that the large terraced blocks of Freeland's Buildings and Poulsome's Place on Middle Brook Street and Freeland Court on Lower Brook were being built and construction may have begun in the 1830's.<sup>193</sup> Albert Place and Prince's Place were built before the 1851 census, but the building boom continued on the street with the construction, in the late 1890's, of the

Edwardian Lansdowne Terrace on the north east side of the street on land previously occupied by the Grey Friars, owned by the college of St. Mary after the Dissolution, and then by Winchester College, which subsequently sold it to private hands.<sup>194</sup> Additionally, the construction of the Henry Woodyer-designed French Gothic Holy Trinity church, completed in 1854, kept stone masons employed and was the second church to be built in Winchester within ten years, after St. Thomas' on Southgate Street.<sup>195</sup>

## Water Dependent Trades

Although dyers and fullers no longer practiced their trades on Middle Brook Street, the occupations involving cloth and clothing manufacture remained well-represented with 21.7 per cent of the working population, or 18 people, involved in apparel manufacturing in 1841.<sup>196</sup> Seventy-one residents worked in apparel manufacturing in 1851, but because of the doubling of the population, this constituted only 20.5 per cent of the working residents, with the number slowly declining by 2-4 per cent every census until only 3.5 per cent, or ten people, were manufacturing clothing, hosiery, hats, gloves and footwear in 1911.<sup>197</sup> Those that remained enjoyed a level of success. The 1911 census lists Frank Leonard Phillips, a 32 year-old hosier, with the means to employ a servant for his wife, two young children and himself. W.H. Forder owned a warehouse on Lower Brook Street that employed many men in the Brooks, who were often employees for life.<sup>198</sup> It was described as the 'biggest in the south of England for wool' and they also processed pelts into parchment, still using the water of the brook in the mid-Eighteenth century.<sup>199</sup> Poulsome Place was built by Forder to house his employees.<sup>200</sup>

Tanners, once active users of the Brooks, thus the name Tanner Street, as well as the related occupations of shoe maker and glover, were traditionally found near butchers in urban settings, as hides were a by-product of butchering.<sup>201</sup> It is not known if the three tanners listed on the 1851 census used the water channels to process hides, as had been done for

almost one thousand years, but without a piped water supply it can be assumed that the brooks continued to be used in some industrial way.<sup>202</sup> Although there are no tanners listed in the censuses after 1851, Shoe makers continued to manufacture in workshops in their homes, accounting for 13.2 per cent of the working population in 1841, but declining steadily to less than one per cent, or two shoe makers, in 1911.<sup>203</sup>

There is strong evidence that the fellmongers, cordwainers and parchment-makers that were present in 1851 and non-existent on Middle Brook Street in 1881 were drawn by new jobs at the Lower Brook foundry or relocated due to improved links with other areas of the country due to the arrival of the railway.<sup>204</sup> Additionally, with the advent of mechanical innovation and the installation of a piped water supply, there is a compelling argument that trades that used the water channels faded away because, by 1881, it wasn't necessary to be located next to the water channel as their water was now supplied through pipes. The censuses reveal that trades that used the water channels abandoned Middle Brook Street twenty years or more before the water was culverted. Therefore, it is likely that they dispersed or changed professions and that the removal of the water channel was not the reason for their move or demise.

## Women's Occupations

Women were most commonly designated the title of 'wife' or nothing at all in the censuses during the nineteenth century. In the Saxon period and early Middle Ages, the addition of *-stere* at the end of a word would represent a 'feminine occupational suffix', identifying a 'spinster' as a woman who spins, and the addition of surnames such as 'Webster', 'Folster' or 'Dyster' for those women who were involved in the processes of weaving, fulling and dyeing.<sup>205</sup> The names gradually 'became less grammatical' and were used by men, as well, thereby losing their importance in identifying women's occupations.<sup>206</sup> The lack of acknowledgement of women's roles continued into the nineteenth century. Caring for the home was a strenuous and time-consuming job in the nineteenth century, and the term 'wife' belittles the jobs that they undoubtedly shared with their husbands.

Additionally, it was common in the nineteenth century for the home to be a ‘place of production of articles or services for sale, such as lodging houses, inns, farms and shops’.<sup>207</sup> Higgs explains that the instructions for enumerators on how to record women’s occupations differed with each census and even with specific instruction, the detail of information was at the whim of the individual enumerator, therefore providing spatial, rather than absolute information.<sup>208</sup> A woman married to an innkeeper surely served customers and cleaned the premises and agricultural labourers were oftentimes women, but were not consistently given occupational titles to indicate their involvement. Women in paid employment outside the home and widows were more often given occupational titles.<sup>209</sup> Keene points out that ‘many widows continued to practice their late husband’s trade, which in itself suggests that they had actively participated in the family business during their husband’s lifetime’.<sup>210</sup> An example of this is Maria Smithers, who owned and ran the Winton Ale House for at least twenty years after her husband’s death sometime between 1881 and 1891.<sup>211</sup> Another widow, thirty two year-old Eva Fossey, owned and ran the Beehive Inn and had three young children, her father and mother, and a nephew living with her.<sup>212</sup> Elizabeth Champion is described as the publican at the Robin Hood pub in 1891, supporting six children ranging in age from three months to nineteen years. In addition, she had five boarders living on the same premises. Although she is listed as ‘married’, there is no mention of her husband.<sup>213</sup> Another common female occupation, ‘laundress’, suggests that the woman cleaned not only the family’s belongings, but also ‘took in’ laundry from other families.<sup>214</sup> In the early 1920’s and 1930’s, ‘nearly all of the women in Middle Brook Street worked in the Snow White Laundry’ on Chesil Street.<sup>215</sup>

Conversely, women are more commonly identified as having ‘independent means’ than men. This may be due to the longer lifespan of women, who inherit from their husband’s or another family member’s estate, and the fact that men tended to preface their occupation with ‘retired’ rather than listing ‘independent’, and were identified in the census by their former occupation.<sup>216</sup>

It is difficult to ascertain exactly how many brothels or individual prostitutes were in operation during the study period. Keene suggests that brothels were run in a variety of ways in the Middle Ages; by the prostitutes themselves or the male homeowner or tenant, and sometimes by a husband and wife team. Prostitution typically supplemented income from another occupation. Therefore, women who listed occupations such as laundress, dressmaker (*scheppestre*), spinner (*spynnestre*) and cutter as their byname, may also have had this second occupation.<sup>217</sup> This may also be the case in censuses of the nineteenth and early twentieth century, as supported by Emerson in his study of Victorian Exeter.<sup>218</sup> Clearly, with the many service men in and around Winchester, prostitution would be a lucrative occupation. In fact, in the 1851 census for Lower Brook Street, four young women in their twenties that lodged with beer retailer James Gilman, tellingly listed their occupations as ‘nothing’. The enumerator was not fooled and made notations onto the census form indicating that he was aware of soldiers entering and leaving the premises late at night.<sup>219</sup>

Based on the occupational data, it is clear that the service and small-scale product industry were the most prominent occupations in the mid-1800’s to the early 1900s. However, the services and products that they provided were different than the ones provided up until then. Pre-1800s, greater focus was on the processes to make cloth, leather and parchment. In the 1800s, the occupations, instead, used finished products, such as cloth for tailoring or leather for shoe making. They were removed from the primary product and moved one step up in the chain of production. Similar to other small cities, such as Salisbury, Winchester never developed any ‘large-scale productive’ industries in the nineteenth century and into the twentieth century, instead maintaining service industries to cater to the changing population.<sup>220</sup> Perhaps this lack of large-scale industry has allowed Winchester to retain a ‘town-like’ atmosphere and for the Brooks to remain a neighbourhood within the town.

## **Buildings and Character**

The placement of properties within the walls contracted and expanded with population fluctuations due to plagues and the wealth of the city, with the affluent citizens involved in the cloth finishing industry building ‘spacious houses away from the commercial bustle of the

High Street' in 1340.<sup>221</sup> By the fifteenth century, however, the cloth industry was declining and the Brooks began to fall into decay.<sup>222</sup> Unfortunately, many of the late medieval, sixteenth and seventeenth century houses on the street did not survive the nineteenth century construction boom, except for 36 Middle Brook Street, a fifteenth or sixteenth century timber-framed building with a brick ground floor, two storeys, attic and tiled roof.<sup>223</sup> However, watercolours, photographs, drawings and engravings have been helpful in identifying properties on the street that are no longer standing.<sup>224</sup> For example, Prout's watercolour of 1813 depicts a peaceful scene of a family fishing in the brook, showing St. Maurice's Church at the end of the street and the cathedral beyond. Unfortunately, all of the

buildings in the illustration have been demolished, except for the cathedral. Figure 22.<sup>225</sup>

A Gilbert Workhouse was established in 1795 on Middle Brook Street by the Gilbert's Act of 1782 and is referred to by Charles Ball in his 'descriptive walk'.<sup>226</sup>

But there is also mention of a workhouse in 1763 in

St Maurice parish and most likely on Middle Brook Street, where 'weddings were stringently encouraged to get women married and away, so that there weren't more illegitimate

paupers'.<sup>227</sup> In 1809, Milner describes the workhouse as being a 'depository of human misery', where parents are separated from their children and 'wicked influences abound'.<sup>228</sup> The New Workhouse was built in 1834-5 on Oram's Arbour, which merged the several workhouses in Winchester into one.<sup>229</sup>

There were a number of small lanes that connected the streets in the Brooks area, which allowed residents to move quickly between buildings, churches and streets. However, due to the number of water channels and streams that had been diverted from the channel, pedestrian and wheeled traffic was restricted.<sup>230</sup> This created an environment of closely-spaced tenements laid out in terraces as in Lansdowne Terrace, around a small courtyard as with Prince's Place, or perpendicular to the street to create more housing, as in Poulsome's Place, Freeland's Buildings and Albert Place.

Antiquarian Alfred Guy L'Estrange visited the city in 1889 and 'used manuscript sources and local folklore' to write a romantic and deferential description of the city. He describes 'a row of houses with overhanging stories and huge dark beams'.<sup>231</sup> Inside,

L'Estrange found 'walls made of aging wattle and daub, herringbone stonework, and "a fine chalk mantelpiece with mouldings and entablature" in the upper front room'.<sup>232</sup> By 1912, the building had become 'conspicuously decrepit' and was torn down by the City Council to prepare for 'road widening and urban improvement works' on Middle Brook Street.<sup>233</sup>

Figure 23 is significant; not only does it provide information on buildings located on the street in 1889, it is also one of the first known illustrations depicting the street after the open



water channel was removed, resulting in a strikingly different atmosphere.<sup>234</sup>

Another interesting 'Gothic' structure described by L'Estrange was built by the builder in charge of demolishing St. Mary Magdelene hospital on Morn Hill in 1798.<sup>235</sup> Named 'The Hermitage' it was constructed with parts taken from the demolished hospital on

Parchment Street and 'materials of Swathling House', which was located somewhere between Winchester and Southampton.<sup>236</sup> He described it as a 'remarkable edifice, built of flints, and of a somewhat "gingerbread" character – a miniature castle with two towers'.<sup>237</sup> The fanciful front room contained walnut panelling, which was unfortunately covered in paint with some places 'adorned with gold and colours', 'tongue and udder' moulding around the ceiling and a carving around the door. The Hermitage was a distinctive building on the street until it was torn down in the 1980s.<sup>238</sup>

## Street Renumbering

With the constant building of homes on Middle Brook Street in the early to mid-1800s, the organised numbering of properties was difficult to initiate, therefore properties tended to be referred to by the name or business of the occupant.<sup>239</sup> The first house number mentioned in the Pavement Commissioner's Minutes is found on 10 October 1836 in reference to a planning application for 'No. 97 on the south side of the High Street...', but numbers were not referenced again until 11 November 1844 in a short list of residents that had borrowed money.<sup>240</sup> Paving issues, sanitation and the numbering of properties were issues that affected most, if not all urban communities in the mid-1800s. London, which struggled with many of the same issues as Winchester, as verified by an article, 'The Wants of London' in the *Illustrated London News*, lacked sewers and drains, major thoroughfares for traffic, 'and, most importantly, a unified plan to achieve all that was needed', leading to the establishment of The Metropolitan Board of Works in 1855 to deal with paving, maintaining, widening and naming the streets, as well as numbering properties.<sup>241</sup> In Winchester, property numbers were not provided in the 1841 census and it is not until the 1851 census that numbers are sporadically mentioned for Middle Brook Street and still not consistently used.<sup>242</sup> It was not until 1881 that all of the entries in the census had numbers, but the lack of numbers in previous censuses from 1851 onward was due to the inconsistency of the enumerators, rather than the lack of property numbers.<sup>243</sup>

Analysis of Kelly's Winchester trade directories of 1903-1906 and a comparison of the 1901 and 1911 censuses confirms that the street was renumbered between 1905 and 1906, bringing order after the great amount of building was completed in the second half of the nineteenth century.<sup>244</sup> Using pubs, identifiable buildings and the surnames of continuous inhabitants as 'anchors', it was possible to identify the new property numbers. The results of this analysis provide useful data for a larger project currently being performed on the renumbering of the city of Winchester. Appendix 12 provides a list of the properties before and after renumbering. Before the renumbering, properties were numbered sequentially up one side of the street and down the other, with an 'a' or 'b' added to a number if a property

was divided. The updated numbering system gave each divided property its own number and ‘criss-crossed’ the street with even numbers issued to the properties on the east side of the street and odd numbers on the west. When new blocks of tenements were built, such as Albert Buildings, Poulsomes Place and Freelands Building, they were given a new set of numbers, followed by the building name. For example, Freelands buildings would be numbered 1 – 14, followed by ‘Freelands Building’, rather than ‘Middle Brook Street’, causing confusion as to the location of the properties. In addition, individual properties on Middle Brook Street were also numbered 1 – 14, creating more confusion. This form of numbering remained in place through the 1905 renumbering and wasn’t resolved until the Slum Clearance in the 1950s, when the buildings were torn down.

The censuses of 1841-1911 have been compiled for this dissertation and are provided in the appendices. As mentioned previously, property numbers were not consistently used until the 1881 census. However, using inferential analysis, it was possible to insert property numbers to many of the entries in which they were missing. Therefore, the property numbers listed on the censuses in the appendices until 1881 are a compilation of numbers taken from the census and conjectured numbers based on research and analysis.

It is notable that the culverting of the water channel doesn’t appear to have a demonstrable affect on the numbers or types of occupations listed in the censuses just prior to and immediately after the sewers were dug. Trades that had used the water from the brook, such as dyer, fuller, brewer, butcher, tanner, and parchment maker, had virtually disappeared from the records before 1851, with only one brewer, two parchment makers and three tanners listed in the census.<sup>245</sup> Brewers appear again in the 1901 and 1911 censuses, but would not have used the water from the Middle Brook in their ales, instead utilising a new piped water supply.<sup>246</sup> Butchers continued to thrive on the street with five listed in 1911, but their practice of washing animal carcasses in the brook had been replaced by more sanitary procedures.<sup>247</sup> The number of shoemakers swelled to 28 in 1851, but decreased significantly in each census until only two remained in 1911.<sup>248</sup> The demise of the leather tanning industry is obviously the reason for this reduction. Similarly, the cloth industry also disappeared with tailors following suit, declining from a high of 23 in 1851 to only seven in 1911.<sup>249</sup> In conclusion, a number of factors influenced the changes in occupations during the

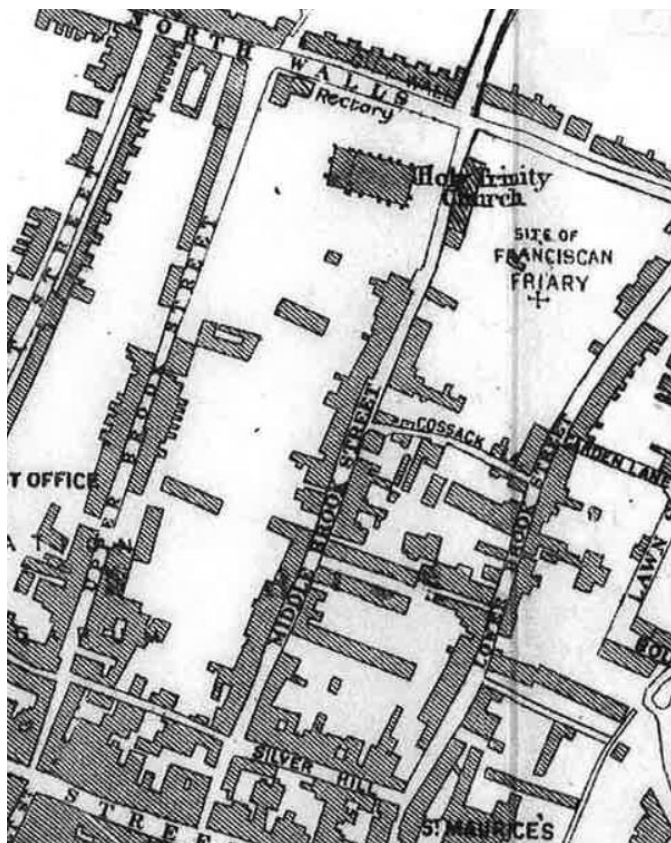
transitional period between 1841 and 1911, when the water channel was removed: the arrival of the railway, enabling more freedom of migration, the movement away from agricultural labourers and toward the building industry to satisfy the demand for housing and institutional buildings, the rise of mechanical advances due to the Industrial Revolution, and finally, the removal of the convenient water source.

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## CHAPTER 4

### THE TWENTIETH CENTURY

Winchester in the Edwardian period is described by James as a ‘comfortable place’ with the postcards of the era depicting a bustling city with new stores on the High Street, such as Boots the Chemist and the International Stores.<sup>250</sup> However, the densely developed Brooks, now home to the tenements of Freeland’s Buildings, Poulsome’s Place, Albert Place and Princes Buildings remained over-crowded and comparatively unsanitary. Occupation remained concentrated toward the High Street and Warren’s Plans of Winchester in 1903

workhouse and slaughterhouse, but published oral histories also testify to a strong sense of community in the neighbourhood of the Brooks.<sup>253</sup> Dyos observes that ‘we may tentatively accept the proposition that urban life is essentially impersonal, secondary, contractual’, but that ‘the inhabitants of certain city neighbourhoods... know that they form a community

does indicate that there were remained some open space on the north end of the street and gardens were large.<sup>251</sup> Improvements to the area focussed on the High Street; the property on the east side that fronted the High Street was torn down to widen the entrance to Middle Brook Street in 1911 and by 1935, Marks and Spencer was in residence on the west corner.<sup>252</sup>

#### **Life on the Street**

In the early twentieth century, Middle Brook Street was home to a mixture of tenements, workshops, medieval buildings, Edwardian terraced housing, pubs, shops, a school,

which for all the ordinary purposes of social life is indistinguishable from that of the authentic village enclosed by fields'.<sup>254</sup> This description can be applied to the Brooks area of Winchester, supported by oral reminiscences of former residents of the street.

Oral testimonies by previous residents of the Brooks provide depth to the understanding of the character of the street. Former resident, Ernest Henry Shergold, was

interviewed in 1976 by city archivist, Austin Whitaker, and fondly recalled that, though those that lived on the street were poor, they were 'good folk'.<sup>255</sup> He described the 'beautiful old houses and

stables', tiny shops such as Harman's 'rag and bone' shop, and the large cooperative bakery on Lower Brook Street.<sup>256</sup> Joan Winnifred Halford, another resident, pointed out that the majority of the residents of the city within the walls lived in the Brooks in the 1920's through 1940's. She recalled that she only knew of only one car in the neighbourhood and that there wasn't any traffic in the early 1900's, enabling large numbers of children to play in the street until late under the gas lamps.<sup>257</sup> Families were large, with seven or eight children not being unusual.<sup>258</sup> Hey believes that, oral histories can 'give a new dimension to our understanding of the past' and should 'be treated as rigorously as any other source of information'.<sup>259</sup>

Residents were poor, but found enterprising ways to earn a living within a busy city environment. Halford remembered the public baths on Lower Brook Street and that patrons could give their trousers to a small girl who would run to Middle Brook Street where her mother would launder and press them, to be returned to the customer at the end of their bath.<sup>260</sup> Barbara Earnshaw recalled collecting rabbit skins and selling them to the rag and bone shop on the street.<sup>261</sup> Many of the residents of the Brooks also worked for Winchester College, respecting the scholars as ‘gentlemen’.<sup>262</sup> The building trades were another source of employment and general labourers accounted for 5 per cent of the total population of the street. In addition, the advent of the motorcar brought new opportunities; 17 are listed as carriers or drivers, with two employed delivering coal and one delivering milk, and two are listed as car mechanics.

The population of the street expanded and contracted along with the total population of the city. In 1911, the residents of Middle Brook Street comprised 2.44 per cent of the total population of Winchester, with 571 residents, as compared to 23,378 in the city as a whole. The censuses following 1911 are not yet available, and no census was taken in 1941 due to the war, but by applying the same percentage toward total population totals of Winchester, it is possible to estimate the number of residents of Middle Brook Street. Using this assumption, there would be approximately 580 in 1921, down to 560 in 1931, and then increasing to around 628 in 1951.<sup>263</sup> It is at this point that the landscape of the street dramatically changed as the ‘slums’ were cleared, changing the proportion of residents on the street to the total of the city. The effect of the slum clearance will be discussed further in the chapter.

## **World War I and World War II**

Winchester abounded with soldiers from all over the world during both wars. The camp at Morn Hill was a transfer point for tremendous numbers of soldiers going to war in Europe and returning home. During World War I, residents remember the Morn Hill camp as a large field of mud, making it a dismal place for those sleeping on the ground. William Blackman, born in 1908, remembered that ‘a great number died simply of exposure up there in the

winter because of lying out in the rain and the snow and slush'.<sup>264</sup> Blackman remembered visiting the camp

where these poor wretches were encamped and often they would come and ask if they could sleep on the floor down in the town, in the houses, and most of the Brooks people I think in those days would let them. I know my mother did. She let half a dozen come and sleep and I expect she gave them a hot drink, though they probably didn't want anything except to sleep on the floor. To be dry. None of these people even locked their doors. Even we never did because there was [sic] never any muggings or break-ins. Anyway, there wasn't much to break in for.<sup>265</sup>

Others remember that troops were billeted in every home and that you were expected to house at least three. The electoral rolls in 1945 provide an example of how many servicemen of voting age were billeted with residents by separating the roll into two registers; the civilian register and the service register. Appendix 13 is a listing of the two registers organised by address. From this information, a number of factors are evident. Firstly, 43 properties, comprising 43 per cent of inhabited properties on the street, contained adults with more than one surname. This indicates that some of the properties had lodgers or boarders, even if they didn't house servicemen. Of the 43 properties, clearly 36 billeted servicemen, and women in a few instances. Secondly, it is apparent that some families had servicemen living with them that shared the same surname, indicating that a spouse or adult child other family member was able to live at home while serving. Finally, in tenements with multiple surnames, it is common to find a female adult sharing the same same surname as a serviceman, suggesting that some military wives accompanied their husbands to Winchester and the couple were able to lodge or board together. In any case, it is evident by the number of adult occupants in each property that the tenements were overcrowded, especially once children are added into the equation.

The Stanmore development was built for returning heroes of the Great War and the first stage was completed in 1923.<sup>266</sup> In addition, three hundred homes were built in Highcliffe in 1926-27 and a small group of homes was built in Winnall in 1929.<sup>267</sup> The new developments provided housing for residents eager to move out of the crowded Brooks. Building work continued after the financial crash of 1929, when the focus became the

construction of the Winchester by-pass, which became an urgent need to enable the flow of military transport as another war loomed.<sup>268</sup>

The war effort consumed the lives of residents, especially during World War II. Building within the city virtually halted during the war, except on the site of the Ritz Cinema on Middle Brook because of its vital importance as a place of entertainment for servicemen.<sup>269</sup> In May of 1942, the Ministry of Home Security Air Raid Precautions Department approved the construction of two public air raid shelters in the Ritz Cinema car park, which could hold 50 people in each.<sup>270</sup>

Residents remember the Brooks area as the ‘heart’ of the city, but children were not shielded from the realities of life on a city street. Resident Norman Barr recalls how upsetting it was for a small child when cows were herded down St. George’s Street to be slaughtered on Middle Brook Street in view of all. He was happy when the slaughterhouses relocated to Winnall after the war.<sup>271</sup> However, happy memories of life in the Brooks remain. Wintonian Greta Chapman fondly remembers walking with her mother to the rag and bone shop in 1948, when four years old, to deliver a sack of rags to Harman’s ‘rag and bone yard’ and receiving a treasured goldfish in exchange, and Derek Harper recalled trapping rabbits in Stanmore and selling the skins to Harman’s to buy hay for his own domestic rabbit.<sup>272</sup>

## Slum Clearance

During the ‘inter-war’ period, there was general concern among town planners throughout urban areas in England that high concentrations of working-class families were grouped in sections of cities and the middle classes were ‘increasingly located in the burgeoning suburbs’.<sup>273</sup> Based on research by Herbert Llewellyn Smith in 1928, the ‘defining characteristic of good town planning’ was ‘a balanced mix between the social classes’.<sup>274</sup> Indeed, this attitude to town planning, particularly in London, led L.E. White, in 1950, to proclaim that the ‘one-income estate had become “the true habitat for a rootless

generation”’.<sup>275</sup> This opinion contrasts with the research done for this dissertation, in which it is evident that residents were very much part of a community, albeit with a proportion of the residents living as lodgers or boarders in short-term accommodation. However, it was determined by city planners, as part of a national initiative related to the Cross Act of 1875, that slums were no longer individual properties that required demolition or improvement, but ‘the slum became an *area* for clearance, large enough to allow redevelopment’.<sup>276</sup> The consequence, it was believed, would be a ‘healthier and happier working class, well housed in a sanitary environment’, its residents would be ‘more law abiding’ and ‘economically productive’, and there would ultimately be a ‘lower poor rate’.<sup>277</sup>

Prestigious town planner, Sir Patrick Abercrombie was commissioned to design a modern development in the Brooks to replace the slums, encompassing Upper, Middle and Lower Brook streets, as well as Eastgate Street, Lawn Street, North Walls and the Durgate area, which he believed should be treated as a ‘precinct’ that could be made ‘one of the most attractive and compact groups of houses in Winchester’, containing ‘two-storey houses, gardens, and streams to make up a romantic composition’.<sup>278</sup> Abercrombie died shortly before his plans were completed and his successor, Peter Sheppard, completed and presented the designs.<sup>279</sup> Abercrombie’s proposal for the redevelopment of Middle Brook Street is outlined posthumously in a news article in the *Hampshire Observer* of 12<sup>th</sup> October, 1957 and is telling in how he envisioned the importance of the community that lived there:

‘Sir Patrick has emphasised that he is not regarding the area as a self-sufficing neighbourhood unit; although within well defined [sic] boundaries, it is not self-contained but a “quarter” or fragment of the ancient city. He visualises there will be few private gardens and that the open spaces will be in the nature of riverside parkways and not playgrounds. A large shopping centre is not wanted with the High-street so close.’

His view indicates that he proposed to strip the Brooks of its neighbourhood character; as it was, in his opinion, merely one part of the greater city and not a distinct unit. Obviously, Abercrombie was attempting to re-define the area to distance it from its reputation as being a slum and undesirable place in which to live and drawing it into the city. Abercrombie believed that most of the 33 acres of land to be developed should be residential

and designed the space so that 18 acres would house 1852 persons in 560 dwellings, envisioning that the development would ‘bring life back into an area that was gradually losing its vitality’.<sup>280</sup> In the 1955 slum clearance survey, 207 of the 417 houses in the Brooks area were deemed of ‘clearance standard’.<sup>281</sup>

‘The plan shows a preponderance of flats, mostly of three-storeys in small units and provides for a total of about 600 dwellings facing on to somewhat narrow roads. Between Holy Trinity Church and the Ritz Cinema, Sir Patrick has provided for the largest of his squares and suggests that it would be suitable for four-storey blocks in maisonettes. For the land between Middle and Lower Brook-streets, the houses on the south side of North Walls are left unchanged and beyond these there are two-storey houses and four blocks of two-storey cottage flats. In the next group, stretching up to the Post Office site, there is provision for a green with a small pavilion fronting on to a small “square” of three storey flats.’<sup>282</sup>  
(see Figure 27 *Abercrombie Plan for Central Winchester*)

Ironically, Mr. T.F. Thompson, County Planning Office, contended that the density of the development ‘was necessary in order to put back into the area a fair proportion of the equivalent population displaced by slum clearance and in order to provide sufficient open amenity features to prevent a recurrence of slum conditions.’<sup>283</sup> Therefore, the apparent intention was to replace the approximately 115 properties on the street with up to 600 modern flats and maisonettes in the “best architectural design”, to create a more attractive and suitable development for a better sort of people to take up residence and bring vitality back to the area.<sup>284</sup>

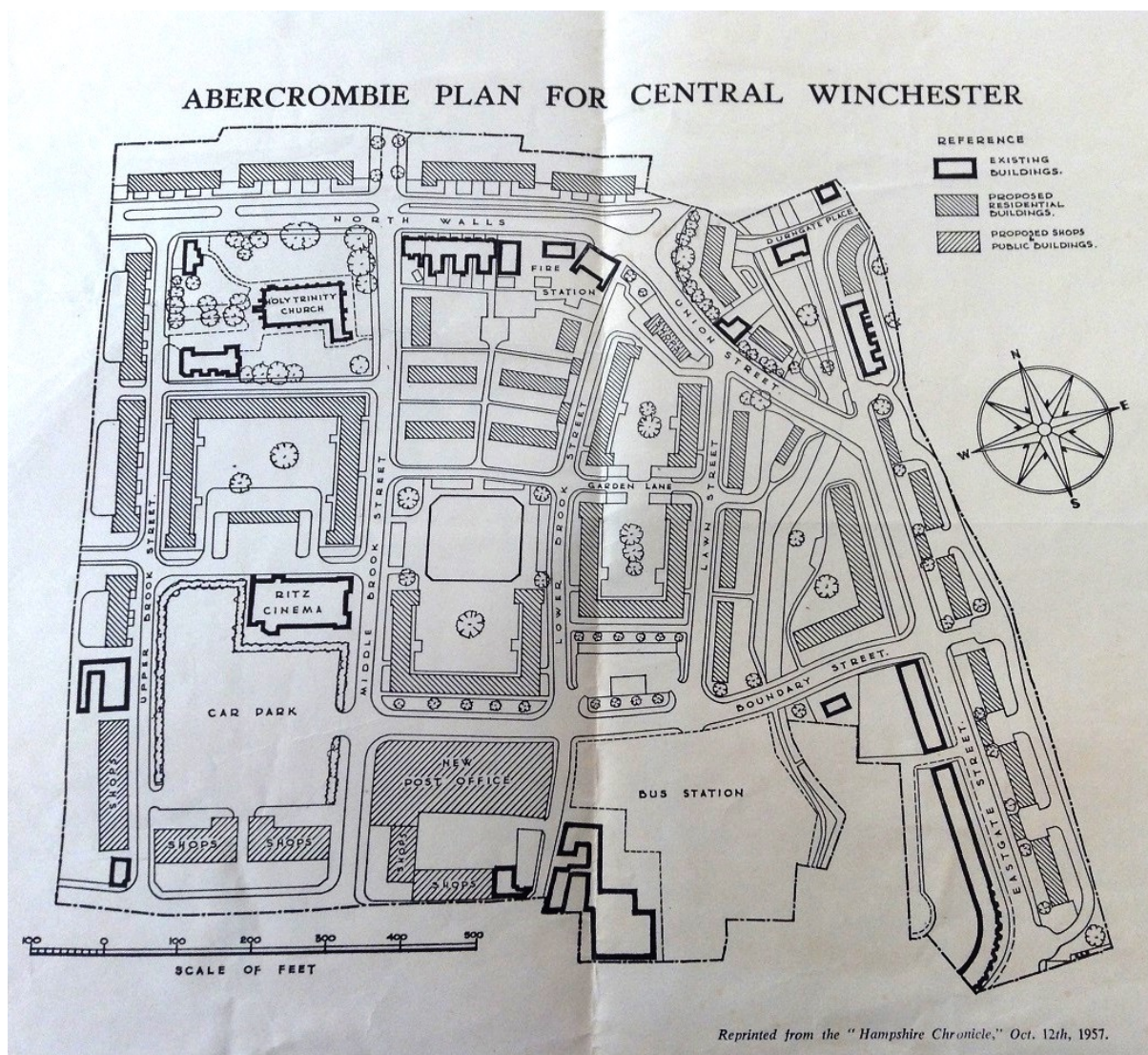

Abercrombie's widespread demolition of the Brooks, save Holy Trinity Church, alarmed owner-occupiers and preservationists, who felt that a number of properties were worth saving. By proposing to demolish most of the street, Abercrombie displayed his disregard for the history and character of the Brooks, dismissing Medieval properties as unimportant. In July of 1958, the City of Winchester Preservation Trust, along with fifty property owners in the areas affected, filed objections to the plans, which were heard by Mr. C.E. Pinel, an inspector of the Ministry of Housing and Local Government.<sup>285</sup> The Preservation Trust argued that the properties from the Ritz Cinema to North Walls on the west side of the street, from Cossack Lane to North Walls on the east side of the street, namely Lansdowne Terrace, and the shops and pub at the corner of Silver Hill should be

retained. They felt that, although the buildings did not have architectural significance, they did conform to the ‘patchwork theory’ of mixed architecture that would provide character to the street. The Trust believed that the buildings ‘although not aesthetically desirable should not be demolished in the interests of planning to make way for modern flats which a future generation may think just as unsightly’.<sup>286</sup> In addition, the Preservation Trust argued that excessive road widening would ruin the character of the ‘area as a whole’, accepting only the necessity to widen Middle Brook Street between St. George’s Street and the new link road, which would become Friarsgate Street, and then as far as Cossack Lane.<sup>287</sup> Other groups, including the Winchester Cottage Improvement Society, argued against the widespread clearing of properties that were solidly built, owner-occupied and had years of use ahead of them.

While the proposal was argued, The City Council was busy purchasing properties, re-housing residents and demolishing some of the buildings that were not in question, including

residents of

buildings to be cleared, the date of demolition of cleared properties, as well as where within the city and suburbs residents were re-housed.<sup>288</sup> Appendix 14 provides the results of the analysis. By 1961, the City Council had begun to act on Abercrombie’s scheme, brought forward by Peter Sheppard, consultant architect, with a phased approach. The expectation

was that the areas that were debated, namely Lansdowne Terrace, would be considered later, after the more urgent southern part of the street was developed.

In 1964, a proposed road traffic plan was presented to the residents of Winchester which, if it had been implemented, would have had a dramatic impact on the Brooks area, in

particular Middle and Upper Brook streets. As can be seen in Figure 29, the proposed traffic would flow down a widened two-way North Walls to a round-a-bout at the junctions with Upper and Middle Brook streets, then continuing on to a widened two-way Eastgate Street, looping around the King Alfred statue and up the High Street, then entering the one-way Middle Brook Street. If this plan had succeeded, Middle Brook Street would have become a busy thoroughfare with a car park consuming one half of the land between Upper Brook and Middle Brook streets.<sup>289</sup> Fortunately, this scheme was not implemented.

## Redevelopment of the Street

The slum clearance of the 1950s dramatically changed the character of the street and cleared the way for modern development, sparing a row of Victorian townhouses, the Ritz Theatre, built in 1941, and one medieval property. The residents of cleared properties were re-housed throughout Winchester, both inside and outside the walls. Pooley explained that, typically, ‘moving people out of the city had the effect of creating urban sprawl with new developments being built outside the city’.<sup>290</sup> However, in Winchester, suburban developments had already been constructed between the wars with and then extended post-World War II, with the addition of 624 houses in Stanmore in 1946 and new homes in Highcliffe were begun in 1948. Also, large estates were developed in Winnall and Weeke.<sup>291</sup> By scattering residents throughout the area, the character of the street as a neighbourhood of small shops and grocers, local pubs, and a sense of a village within a city was forever lost.

In the 1980’s there was another surge of development with the addition of the King’s Walk retail and post office complex and multi-level car park.<sup>292</sup> A Victorian warehouse within the development was retained and became an antique’s market after public outcry. The King Alfred Boy’s Club was built in 1982 on cleared property on the west side of Middle

Brook Street, next to Holy Trinity Church. It was then replaced by three homes in Trinity Gardens and four terraced houses facing Middle Brook Street c.2001. In 1991, the substantial Brooks Centre shopping centre was built on land that had been cleared for a central car park. The controversial development included an underground car park, which permanently damaged many

archaeological remains of medieval, Saxon and Roman properties.<sup>293</sup> The southern end of Middle Brook Street had, by the year 2000, had been absorbed into the retail centre of the city. Further north, a car park covered an ancient Roman temple and the old Ritz Cinema was replaced first by the Top Rank Bingo Hall, then the Middle Brook Street Church. APPENDIX 14 includes data on the changes to the buildings on the street in 1960, 1982, and 2014.

Residential properties were confined to the northern third of the street, with the surviving fifteen Lansdowne Terrace properties remaining on the north eastern side of the street. The reduced number of residents live in a mix of council houses, owner-occupied homes and rental properties and their 'trades' now include doctor, public relations executive, university professor, and software developer. Recent home prices have soared due to the popularity of Winchester, voted the Best Place to Live in England in 2006 in a study commissioned by Channel Four, causing the three bedroomed Edwardian terraced properties to sell for an average of £465,000 in 2014, compared to an average of £86,000 ten years before.<sup>294</sup> Although the residential area of the street is smaller, residents have endeavoured to establish a neighbourhood spirit, closing the street to hold a rousing Royal Wedding Street Party in 2012.

The residents of the street are no longer dependent on the water supply for their livelihoods and live on the street because of the convenient location to the city centre and beautiful surroundings, which include the Itchen River. The water table is high, as it is in a river valley and residents deal with damp, cracks on walls from settling and occasional flooding of the surrounding area. However, the raised chalk island on which Middle Brook Street is sited continues to assist in keeping properties dry.

The evolution of Middle Brook Street will continue even further with the impending Silver Hill Development, which engulfs one quarter of the city centre. The highly contentious proposal includes a seven-story building that is a mix of retail, luxury flats and car park in its core, with an elevation as high as the cathedral.<sup>295</sup> The developers have attempted to appease opponents of the massive and dense development by reinstating the Medieval street plan and re-opening a small section of the Lower Brook water channel as a heritage feature and pleasant river walk. Residents and businesses have banded together to

fight this development, which will change not only the character of the street, but of the entire city of Winchester.

## CONCLUSION

Middle Brook Street has a long history of habitation that reaches back to the Roman period. Its site on a raised 'island' in the Itchen River valley, remained dry, but was adjacent to a convenient water source, thereby making it an ideal site for early habitation. The Saxons further developed the street and dug channels down the centre of the Brooks to supply the city with fast-flowing, clear spring water. Residents and trades grew on Middle Brook Street due to the availability of the water for use in tanning, dyeing, fulling, brewing and to rinse entrails. This unique urban environment contributed to the success of the cloth and wool industries in Winchester during the Medieval period. Peripheral industries, such as shoe-makers and parchment-makers, set up on the street to be near the source of the raw goods used in their production.

The loss of royal patronage in the thirteenth century resulted in a decline in Winchester, but the trades that utilised the water continued to produce goods for local consumption. The water channels were used not only for processes and household consumption, but also as a convenient dump, resulting in the spread of cholera and other illnesses and in the overcrowded Brooks area the lifespan of residents was sixteen years shorter than the rest of England in 1850. As the fortunes of the city expanded and contracted, so did occupation on Middle Brook Street, with residents expanding toward the North Wall during times of growth and abandoning properties to move closer toward the city centre during periods of decline. Evidence of water-dependent trades being practised on Middle Brook Street continued until the 1850s. However, by that time, the water had become a nuisance, rather than a benefit.

This dissertation set out to analyse the residents and trades of Middle Brook Street from 1800 to 2000, with a focus on those trades that used the water in their processes. Using the censuses of 1841-1911, the demographics of the residents were analysed and it was found that it was not an unusual working-class urban environment, compared to London or Salisbury. However it was lacking any large-scale industry. Therefore, the focus of occupations tended to be in the service industries, providing goods and services to citizens of Winchester.

The underlying aim was to determine if the removal of the water channel in 1875 affected these specialised trades that had existed on the street for one thousand years and also if the character of the street changed over the time period.

From the research, it is clear that dyers and fullers vacated the street long before the 1800s, but tanners, parchment-makers and brewers remained until the 1850s, although it is not known if they continued to use the water channels in their production. However, it is possible, since Middle Brook Street did not have a piped water supply. By 1861, all of the trades were all gone. As this was more than twenty years before the water was relegated to the sewers, it clearly shows that the removal of the water channel was not the reason for their move or demise.

Finally, the third objective of the dissertation was to study the changes in character on the street from the nineteenth to the twenty-first century. The Brooks area of the city in the Medieval period was a mix of trades people with some more prominent citizens. Tenements had large gardens and there was open space on the north end of the street. Closer to the city centre, development was more crowded. The water channel running down the centre of the street provided romantic images for artists to paint, but in reality, the water contributed to the spread of disease in the Brooks and the city.

In the nineteenth century, the population increased dramatically and buildings began to take over the open space. Densely built tenements were constructed at right angles to the street to house more people, families were large, and most also took in lodgers and boarders for extra money. In 1875, the water channels were culverted and the defining feature of the street was gone. After that, change happened even more rapidly. As part of a national effort to clean up slum conditions, the large tenements built in the nineteenth century were torn down and replaced by car parks. New street plans were proposed in response to the growth in automobile use, and new high density development plans were drawn up by prominent town planners. In the end, caution took hold and the northern half of the street escaped large-scale development and remained residential. Closer to the High Street, however, large retail developments were built in the 1980s and 1990s, as well as more parking. In 2014, the terraced housing that was once associated with a slum now can cost half of a million pounds and residents are doctors, marketing executives and software developers. Those that live there are no longer dependent on water for their livelihoods, and their water supply now flows in a pipe, but the name continues to honour the long history of the water channel that defined the street.
